The Administration of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs (OHA) <u>SUPPORTS</u> SR80/SCR144 Proposed SD1, which expresses support for Hawaiii to host the 2016 World Conservation Congress of the International Union for the Conservation of Nature (IUCN). Hosting the 2016 IUCN World Conservation Congress would allow Hawaiii to share our cultural heritage regarding conservation with leaders from around the world.

The IUCN is the world's oldest and largest global environmental organization international organization dedicated to the conserving biodiversity. It is composed of more than 1200 government and non-governmental organizations, with nearly 11,000 volunteer scientist in more than 160 countries. Held every four years, the IUCN World Conservation Congress is the world's largest and most important conservation event bringing together people from around around the world to discuss the world's most pressing conservation issues. The IUCN World Conservation Congress has never been held in the United States since its inception in 1948.

OHA supports Hawai'i hosting the 2016 IUCN World Conservation Congress because it presents a unique opportunity for Hawai'i to share how Native Hawaiians traditional and customary practices promote conservation. Hawai'i, despite its relative isolation, has a rich heritage of sustainability and self-sufficiency. Our ancestors understood the importance of living in harmony with the natural environment, and were able to support remarkable levels of people without depleting our islands' limited resources. Through an ahupua'a system of land management and with shared cultural practices of aloha (respect), laulima (cooperation) and mālama (stewardship), Native Hawaiians were able to maintain a desireable pono (balance) between the 'āina and the people it sustained.

Accordingly OHA supports SR80/SCR144 Proposed SD1. Mahalo for the opportunity to submit testimony on this important matter.

The University of Hawai'i strongly supports the SCR 144/SR 80 Proposed SD1 expressing the Hawai'i State Legislature's support for Hawai'i's bid to host the 2016 World Conservation Congress (WCC) of the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN).

The University of Hawai'i has been actively working for several years to support the coalition working to bring WCC to Hawai'i alongside our partners in government and the private and non-profit sectors.
