# I. Background and Summary

1. Ho'i Ho'i Ea is a 501(c)(3) federally-recognized non-profit community organization. It was established as part of an effort to reclaim kuleana kalo (taro) fields that had been lost due to change in ownership about 10 years ago. Funding from Clean Water Act (federal), through the State Health Department, State Legacy Lands funds and the City & County of Honolulu's Clean Water Natural Lands funding has provided resources to re-acquire these farm lands and restore the kalo farm that was actively farmed for over 200 years. The purpose of this grant is to restore these ancient farm lands to productivity and meet a rising demand for taro products.

- 2. The specific goals and objectives of this grant application is to provide two vital pieces of farm equipment that are needed to replace old, dilapidated equipment Necessary to get the farm fully operational again. This grant will also support connection of utilities needed to establish a commercial kitchen where processing of the farm products can occur.
- 3. The demand for locally-grown taro products has risen dramatically in recent years. Due to a chronic shortage of locally grown kalo, it is critical that the State of Hawai'i support restoration and reclamation of lo'i kalo or taro farms wherever possible to meet local market demand. In addition, there is increasing interest in and market potential for export of various taro products outside the State of Hawai'i. Making kalo more sustainable here in the islands, as well as a healthier and more viable part of the agricultural economy would justify investment by the State of Hawai'i in restoring this taro farm to full productivity once again.
- 4. The target population to be served is the people of the State of Hawai'i; a secondary target population would be out-of-state consumers.
- The Hakipu'u kalo fields are located in the ahupua'a of Hakipu'u, district of Ko'olaupoko, O'ahu.

#### II. Service Summary and Outcomes

1. The scope of work for this project focuses primarily on three areas: acquisition of equipment to replace old and non-working farm equipment; connection of major

utilities to enable establishment of a commercial kitchen for processing of farm products; and renovation of existing farm kitchen to meet commercial kitchen/DOH standards.

- The projected timeline for implementing the tasks of this grant would be:
   Months 1-3 Acquire farm equipment and begin preparing the land and planting
   Months 4-6 Acquire permits and complete applications for utility installations
   and hookups
  - Months 7-9 Begin renovations to farm kitchen to convert to commercial kitchen Months 10-12 Complete inspections and processing of application for commercial kitchen.
- 3. Quality assurance, evaluation and monitoring of this project will include the following activities:
  - Keep a log of tasks, duration, and when completed
  - Provide quarterly reports of progress to funders and other stakeholders
  - Maintain records of expenditures to ensure compliance with funding limitations (i.e., remaining within budget)
- 4. These are the measures of effectiveness to demonstrate that the project has been implemented successfully:
  - Respond to monthly State Dept. of Agriculture census to report poundage of taro harvested, acreage in production, etc.
  - Maintain a log of clearing, planting, harvesting and marketing of farm product
  - Identify what improvements may be needed for future expansion of the farm

## IV. Experience and Capability

## A. Necessary Skills and Experience

Applicant includes a family of Hawaiian kalo farmers who have been farming taro for many generations, cultural practitioners and others who have experience in education and land trust management. The non-profit works with the Trust for Public Lands, which assisted Ho'i Ho'i Ea in reclaiming this property and soliciting public funds for re-acquiring the farm lands.

#### B. Facilities

On the property, there is a farm house adjacent to the taro fields. The fields are irrigated by auwai from nearby Hakipu'u Stream. However, the farm house is in need of utility upgrades to meet requirements of the DOH for a certified commercial kitchen. This grant would facilitate improvements to make this farm capable of processing food products for market distribution.

## V. Personnel: Project Organization & Staffing

# A. Proposed Staffing, Staffing Qualifications, Supervision & Training

First six months, applicant will relay upon volunteer labor to begin the clearing, planting and harvesting of kalo at the farm. Subsequently, revenues from farm products will provide resources to hire farm labor and other employees. Primary staff needs are for: (1) farm manager; (2) farm workers; (3) marketing specialist; (4) volunteer coordinator; and (5) cultural education specialist to work with youth groups and visitors.

- (2) Utilizing volunteers to promote and teach cultural awareness programs.
