I. Background and Summary

1. A brief description of the applicant's background; Hui Pono Holoholona is dedicated to improving the lives of animals on the Island of Hawaii. The 501c3 nonprofit was established in 2006 Visit website www.hphhawaii.org and FaceBook page. Over 3,000 dogs and cats have been spay/neutered through HPH efforts. PAWS - Pono Animal Way Sanctuary near Mt. View was opened in 2014. The 20 acre Farm Lot is currently home to 75 felines. 25 of the rescued cats have come recently from Pahoia Town cat colony areas, with more anticipated.
2. The goals and objectives related to the request; - Fencing of the Sanctuary has become painfully apparent. On December 2, 2014 15 felines were killed by a pack of loose dogs. The attacks have continued with at least 1 cat killed on the property each week. Immediate efforts to fence the one acre dozed area for safety of relocated cats has begun, we will build this 1 acre fence with \$6,000 in donations and mostly volunteer labor. Fencing of more acreage will increase the safety and capacity of the Sanctuary. The remaining 19 acres are untouched, with Ohia trees and mostly level ground, a backhoe with hammer will be rented to clear the fence line and drill the holes.
3. The public purpose and need to be served.
4. Humane relocation of Cat Colonies from the Lava path. Many business and communities have cat colonies that may become endangered by the advancing lava. Having already trapped, spay/neutered and relocated 25 felines.
5. Describe the target population to be served; Puna area in the projected lava path. Rescue efforts will move along with the lava path.
6. Describe the geographic coverage. Lower Puna - Pahoia Town. Several Communities in the Lava's projected path.

II. Service Summary and Outcomes

1. Describe the scope of work, tasks and responsibilities; In December 2014 worked with Malama Market Feeders and Security at night to Trap 10 cats of that colony. Spayed 6 females and neutered 4 males with local veterinarian. Other relocations have occurred from the Pahoia Bay Clinic and 7-11 Store areas. All taken to PAWS to be cared for and if adoptable seek homes. Volunteers continue this effort now and into 2016.

2. Provide a projected annual timeline for accomplishing the results or outcomes of the service; The one acre fence will be built in early 2015. The larger Fence Project would be built in later 2015/2016 if Grant funds approved. Rescue efforts are ongoing, as the Lava moves so shall efforts.

3. Describe its quality assurance and evaluation plans for the request. Specify how the applicant plans to monitor, evaluate, and improve their results; The fencing will improve safety and security for the animals. Galvanized steel post will be concrete set, in holes drilled into the solid lava rock .

Board Members and Volunteers have worked many long and hard hours conducting over 40 spay/neuter clinics, tending to TNRM cat colonies and taking in many unfortunates for hands on care. We have worked with many veterinarians aiding with pre and post operating procedures.

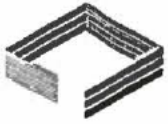
