Implementation phase for *Points of Contact: Continuity and Change and Iolani Palace*, a group of new permanent exhibits that will expand the timeline of the Palace's history and integrate new topics with special significance for contemporary Native Hawaiians. These exhibits will reveal the extent to which the Palace served as a stage for the complex story of Hawaii and its contact with Europe, Asia, and the United States. The exhibits will be installed in 4,590 sq. ft. on the lower level of the Palace, in the central hallway and former storage and service areas. The overall project spans 6,020 sq. ft. and includes way-finding and general design for adjoining areas to create a cohesive visitor experience.

Additionally, the work will also encompass repairing, restoring, and refinishing interior walls, ceilings, flooring, windows, doors, upgrading

electrical wiring and network cabling for the new exhibits, and installation of security equipment.

Funds may also be used to address high priority repair projects throughout the Palace Complex (Palace, Barracks, Coronation Pavilion, Kanaina Building) to perform hazard mitigation, repair damage, improve energy efficiency, upgrade security, weather proofing, and upgrade of visitor services facilities.

Grant monies are to cover costs incurred from July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016.

This application is to provide direct financial assistance for capital improvements to the Iolani Palace Complex. The applicant was founded in 1966 for the express purpose of supporting and guiding the restoration and management of Iolani Palace as a historic

site and museum. Once the Palace reopened to the public in 1978, the applicant has dedicated itself to perpetuating the history of the Hawaiian monarchy. The applicant's main goal is to operate the Palace as an educational facility and to provide visitors (students, local residents and tourists) with a fresh understanding of Hawaii's royal heritage.

The Session Laws of Hawaii for 2007, as contained in Act 291, statutorily designated The Friends of Iolani Palace as the State of Hawaii Museum of Monarchy History as the Legislature found that The Friends provides an important public service in maintaining this significant building.

In February 2014, The Friends of Iolani Palace received accreditation by the American Alliance of Museums, joining only four other museums in Hawaii: Bishop Museum, Honolulu Museum of Art, Mission Houses Museum, and Lyman House.

#### B. Facilities

Iolani Palace is arguably the most significant historical building in Hawaii and an iconic symbol that the former Hawaiian Kingdom was an internationally recognized nation-state. It also stands as a powerfully emotional symbol of the Hawaiian Renaissance movement. As a state facility, ADA requirements are handled by the state Dept. of Land and Natural Resources.

## V. Personnel: Project Organization and Staffing

Glenn Mason, who heads the firm, was one of the architects involved in the restoration of Iolani Palace in the 1970s and the Iolani Barracks in the 1960s.


