I. Background and Summary

1. A brief description of the applicant's background;

The mission of the Young Women's Christian Association of O'ahu (YWCA) is "to empower women, eliminate racism and to promote peace, justice, freedom and dignity for all people." Founded in 1900, the YWCA is the oldest and largest women's membership organization in Hawai'i. Strengthened by its membership of over 2,200 O'ahu residents, the YWCA thrives as a place of leadership and service for women and girls.

Owned and operated by the YWCA, the YWCA Kokokahi is an eleven-acre recreational complex on Kāne'ohe Bay. This property is a valuable resource for the Windward O'ahu community, with a full-size gymnasium, locker rooms, overnight cabins, classrooms, a large kitchen, and meeting spaces. With access to the mountains and ocean, Kokokahi is ideal for environmental exploration and cultural learning.

2. The goals and objectives related to the request;

Funding is requested to construct a new roof and upgraded roof support structure for MidKiff Gymnasium at the YWCA Kokokahi. The existing roof has deteriorated due to coating that is inadequate for its proximity to the ocean. The YWCA contracted a structural engineering assessment which concluded that a new roof is needed because of advanced corrosion and because the supporting members of the roof do not meet current building code requirements.

This project is part of a broad capital improvement plan that will support longstanding programs at Kokokahi, including YWCA Aquatics and our 20-year long Adapted Swim program, cultural camps, retreats, and sports programs. Following the sale of a small parcel and with funding from Harold K.L. Castle Foundation, the YWCA rehabilitated two cottages, resurfaced the Kokokahi Pool, and upgraded site infrastructure: internet, phone systems, security systems. The next phase of improvements includes the re-roofing the gym, upgrading the Atherton Hall kitchen and resurfacing the concrete in several areas.

3. The public purpose and need to be served;

The YWCA Kokokahi began as Dr. Theodore Richard's vision of a lifelong dream of a Christian inter-racial community where people of Hawaii could live and work together. In 1927, a period of time when most people were aligned in ethnically segregated camps, he envisioned a place where the diverse people of Oahu would coexist in harmony and fellowship. They would be kokokahi, "of one blood." The YWCA assumed exclusive stewardship of Kokokahi in 1972.

Today, Kokokahi supports programs and activities that foster body, mind and soul connections between diverse individuals. Kokokahi is accessible by bus, and provides a location for safe, supervised afternoon activity for local children. Its location on Kāne'ohe Bay, with access to the mountains and ocean, lends to outdoor activities and environmental exploration for kids.

Describe the target population to be served; and

The YWCA Kokokahi serves children and families in Windward Oʻahu. For families on Oʻahu, it is increasingly difficult to access outdoor learning explorations, as many parent work more than full time and children spend out of school hours in urban locations or crowded homes with no yard, removed from the natural environment. Kokokahi supports cultural learning programs effectively combat risk factors because they enable youth to develop cultural identities. "A strong ethnic identity is associated with healthy self-esteem and resistance to negative stereotypes," according to the University of Hawaii Center on Family. Additionally, in an age when media images and popular culture often exacerbate racial tensions among youth, cultural learning can provide a common ground for teens to communicate and work together through conflict.

Describe the geographic coverage.

Kokokahi is located on Kāne'ohe Bay and it is one of the few locations in the area with beachfront access to the bay and ample parking. This is the only camping facility in Windward O'ahu that offers overnight accommodations to both small and large groups. It is close to the Waikalua Loko Fishponds, Kāne'ohe and Kawa Streams, and the Friendship Gardens.

II. Service Summary and Outcomes

The YWCA requests \$300,000 to replace the roof and upgrade the roof structure of the Midkiff Gymnasium at Kokokahi. The existing roof has deteriorated due to coating that is inadequate for

its proximity to the ocean. A structural engineering assessment conducted by William Blakeney Inc. concluded that a new roof is needed because of advanced corrosion and because the supporting members of the roof do not meet current building code requirements.

With initial support from the lead funder Harold K.L. Castle Foundation, the YWCA completed engineering assessment and conceptual design. Ferraro Choi and Associates completed the conceptual design, which was used to develop the initial cost estimate. William Blakeney conducted a structural engineering assessment and recommended the new metal roof approach. This approach was the foundation for our preliminary construction contract estimate, which was provided by Health Construction, Inc.

The following activities are planned for this project:

- 1. Secure grants to fulfill the 50% of project budget
- 2. Contract design and permit work
- 3. Secure grants to remaining 50% of project budget
- 4. Begin construction demolition
- 5. Complete framing and structural modifications
- 6. Remove old coating and apply new coating to structural steel elements
- 7. Install new metal roof
- 8. Complete finish work and final inspections
 - Provide a projected annual timeline for accomplishing the results or outcomes of the service;

The YWCA has contracted Fray Heath of Heath Construction, Inc. to serve as project manager. Mr. Heath will monitor and evaluate the progress of the project and provide progress reports and necessary feedback to the YWCA Facilities Committee.

4. List the measure(s) of effectiveness that will be reported to the State agency through which grant funds are appropriated (the expending agency). The measure(s) will provide a standard and objective way for the State to assess the program's achievement or accomplishment. Please note that if the level of

The project will be effective if the Midkiff Gymnasium Roof is completed on time, within budget, and meeting all outcomes. The outcomes will be evaluated individually, as follows:

Outcome #1: Improved safety for youth and adults who participate in activities in the Midkiff Gymnasium. Upon final inspection the roof is confirmed to be safe and meeting specifications and building code guidelines. Specifically this project will bring the roof to conformance of existing wind load requirements, which have changed since the original roof was designed.

Outcome #2: Improved financial stability of Kokokahi due to sustained earned income from tenants in second level of the gymnasium and ongoing rentals of lower (gym) level by tenants and partners.

Outcome #3: Increased viability of new program initiatives that rely on access to the gym, including summer and intercession camps, women's retreats and environmental excursions for youth.

Outcome #4: Kokokahi is preserved for use by the Windward O'ahu community – families, nonprofits, schools – and the Midkiff Gymnasium continues to be dedicated to this purpose. Through this project, the YWCA reaffirms its commitment to preserving this property for public benefit.

The YWCA of O'ahu has an established history of service, support and leadership in this community. The organization owns and operates three facilities on O'ahu, including Lāniakea, its downtown headquarters; Fernhurst Residence, a transitional home in Makiki; and Kokokahi in Kāne'ohe.

In recent years, the organization has accomplished significant work in support of women and families. In 2014, 666 women came to Dress for Success Honolulu for professional attire; 508 women and children stayed at Fernhurst Residence, out of which 70% received some form of subsidy; and 51 survivors of domestic violence created a financial safety plan and monthly budget. The YWCA also established the Patsy T. Mink Center for Business and Leadership, which helps women create and sustain viable business ventures.

The YWCA is the sole owner of the Kokokahi property at 45-035 Kaneohe Bay Drive. Site control is not an issue.

He will work directly with Candice Wessinger, COO, to support the project and oversee fiscal issues. The project will also be overseen by a volunteer Facilities Committee, which reports to the YWCA Board of Directors.

The cost estimate was prepared by Fray Heath, President of Heath Construction Services, Inc. Mr. Heath has agreed to serve as project manager, after a search was conducted by the Facilities Committee. Mr. Heath is well qualified to lead this project, having received his education at UCLA with a degree from the School of Engineering specializing in Structural Engineering and Mechanics. He graduated Cum Laude in 1971. He has been a general contractor and project manager in Hawaii since 1977. Recent projects managed by this firm include a \$1.5 million renovation to The Pacific Club and a \$13 million renovation to NIKETOWN retail store in Waikiki.

Pursuant to Section 42F-103, Hawai'i Revised Statutes, for grants used for the acquisition of land, when the organization discontinues the activities or services on the land acquired for which the grant was awarded and disposes of the land in fee simple or by lease, the organization shall negotiate with the expending agency for a lump sum or installment repayment to the State of the amount of the grant used for the acquisition of the land.
