### I. Background and Summary

- 1. A brief description of the applicant's background; Mr. Bates, President of Community Resiliency, LLC has 30 years of experience in the Emergency Management field. He has extensive practical field experience internationally and some experience domestically. He is a Graduate of the University of California at Berkeley graduate certificate in Emergency Preparedness and Planning (1996). Mr. Bates has a Masters in Public Administration (MPA) with a focus in Health Services from Golden Gates University in San Francisco (1982). He also has a Masters in National Security Studies from the Naval War College (1995). Mr. Bates designed and taught a Graduate Certificate Disaster Management program at Hawaii Pacific University for seven years (2005-2012. Mr. Bates has been a Hospital Field Company Commander for the 3<sup>rd</sup> Marines in Korea and Thailand, Lead Field Operations Planner for the Joint Operations Tele-medicine Advanced Concept Technology Project at the US Pacific Command from 1998-2003. He deployed innovative technology applications and hardware in rural and urban areas in Southeast Asia and Hawaii. He was the Program Manager for the Center of Excellence in Disaster management and Humanitarian Assistance from (COE now CFE) 2003-2005. From 2006-2012 Mr. Bates provided 35 high level US Pacific Command engagements in Southeast Asia and South Asia in support of Disaster preparedness and disaster recovery. Mr. Bates has provided training to Senior government officials in Asia and Africa related to Business Continuity Planning and disaster response to large-scale infectious disease outbreaks. Mr. Bates is a recognized subject matter expert and teacher of Emergency Management in the Asia-Pacific region and Hawaii.
- 2. The goals and objectives related to the request; Warning and Evacuation are two extremely difficult tasks for Emergency Managers to get funded and to execute. Warning systems are predicated on four elements; good hazard identification and analysis, effective detection systems, ability to disseminate the correct message(s) in real time, and a comprehensive public education program. Death and injuries at the start of a disaster exponentially increase when the public is caught by surprise, or are trapped while trying to move to safety. Unwise and uninformed decisions by public

officials and the public at the outset of a disaster can cause unnecessary deaths and injuries. A critical aspect of building sustainable communities is informing the population of the warning and evacuation plans from coastal areas, as well as providing the most updated technologies and methods for accomplishing this difficult and dangerous task. The goal of this project is to update the elected officials (who are ultimately responsible), local Emergency Managers and their constituents to the likely coastal hazards they face, the systems and processes in place they can utilize (Public education), and to present alternatives to current practices that support sustainable coastal activities and development.

- 2. **State the public purpose and need to be served;** The project will provide elected officials up-to-date information on processes, systems, procedures and technologies being deployed globally to build and protect vulnerable coastal communities. The report and recommendations will provide State lawmakers and local Emergency Managers with a list of "Best Practices" being employed around the world as part of the Hyogo Framework for Action version II (HFA II) that was just approved last March in Sendai, Japan. HFA II states that decision-making and resources be pushed down to the local levels where and when possible. This initiative is in direct support of HFA II guidelines and protocols. The each island report will include cost estimates for new technologies should they be indicated.
- 3. **Describe the target population to be served**; The people of Hawaii and the eight million tourists who visit our islands annually.
- 4. **Describe the geographic coverage.** Coastal Population areas around the state. Demographics focused to three miles in from the coast on each island where the population density is more than 5 people per square mile. This is easily accomplished using FEMA generated GIS applications and technologies.

### II. Service Summary and Outcomes

1. **Describe the scope of work, tasks and responsibilities**; The first task is to map the coastal areas with population densities of 5 or more people per square mile from the coast, and where there are critical infrastructure activities taking place. The work will consist of documenting "Best Practices" for "Warning and Evacuating" of coastal areas around the world based on the coastal hazards facing the state. There will be two trips to each island to meet with Emergency Managers and community leaders. The research will be written-up in a formal report for each island. The recommendations and findings can be briefed at Legislative hearings and other public forums to include coastal community Neighborhood Boards. Public education will be accomplished through Town Hall style meetings

on all the islands, media exposure and public debate. Community Resiliency LLC will provide accurate information to each island community in order for them to consider changes, request additional funding, provide more Public education, and provide a list of tasks the people can do for themselves during warning and evacuation stages of a disaster.

- 2. The applicant shall provide a projected annual timeline for accomplishing the results or outcomes of the service; The first nine months will be the research, documentation, and production of the reports for each island. The last three months will be the presentation of the findings and recommendations around the state once the legislature and State/Local Emergency Managers have been briefed. A series of Town Hall and Neighborhood Board sessions will be scheduled to facilitate discussion of the Findings and recommendations.
- 3. The applicant shall describe its quality assurance and evaluation plans for the request. Specify how the applicant plans to monitor, evaluate, and improve their results; It is recommended that a member of the Senate or House sponsor the project and get monthly updates on the progress of the project. Mr. Bates will work closely with the staff of the elected official and local Emergency Managers, providing monthly summary reports on the progress and possible obstacles encountered.

He has recently lectured at FEMA and the East-West Center on subjects related to relocation of large populations and collecting data on small disasters globally. He is a seasoned instructor, experienced field worker, and subject matter expert on issues surrounding Emergency Management including "Warning and Evacuation."
