

A brief description of the applicant's background;

The Hawaii Floriculture and Nursery Association (HFNA) is a statewide umbrella organization with approximately 300 members. Our membership is made up with breeders, hybridizers, propagators, growers, shippers, wholesalers, retailers, educators, and the allied industry, which supports our efforts in agriculture. HFNA is a non-profit corporation under Section 501(c) (6) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

The floriculture and nursery industry is Hawaii's second largest commodity group with \$69.1 million in sales in 2012, second only to the seed corn industry. At its peak in 2007, the floriculture and nursery industry sales value was \$108 million.

HFNA has been a strong supporter and contributor to formulate the first Hawaii Biosecurity Plan. HFNA members worked with the Hawaii Department of Agriculture on the pilot programs, which worked towards expanding their markets, lowering pest problems in their operations, and increased research on cultivar development.

The goals and objectives related to the request;

Cut flowers, foliage, and produce imported into Hawaii present high risks for invasive species that have an adverse impact on our local agriculture, environment, economy, and ultimately, quality of life. The introduction of invasive species through imported plants and plant products, such as cut flowers, Christmas Trees, and cut foliage, pose direct harm to our farmers who are ultimately threatened by embargos on their products. So although the farmers are not the importers, and thus do not bring in the invasive species, they are blamed for the spread of the insects, pests and diseases, and their livelihoods become threatened.

Goal. To increase the ability for the floriculture and nursery industries to achieve economic sustainability thus assisting the State to reach the goal of a healthy and sustainable diversified agricultural industry. The objectives include the following:

- Expand markets globally, both international and domestic, and complementing the current Buy Local Campaign sponsored by the State of Hawaii;
- Reduce pests leaving the farms and nurseries and promoting a clean export initiative for both interisland and overseas exported commodities; and
- Continue and hopefully increase research in new cultivars to remain competitive and maintain Hawaii's market share in the local, domestic and international markets.

The public purpose and need to be served;

Achieving a healthy, sustainable, and hopefully robust diversified agricultural industry is the long term goal, however, in the short-term, the goal is to stabilize the agriculture industry. Especially in the wake of the closing of both HC&S and Hamakua Springs Country Farms, HFNA wants to expand the markets to increase the opportunities to allow existing and new farmers and nursery operators to be successful. The Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) for all counties includes the agriculture industry as a major component of their economy.

The clean export initiative will work toward reducing the movement of invasive species on exported floral commodities, both interisland and overseas. This is a positive method of reducing the interisland flow of invasive species, in lieu of negative (draconian) measures, introduced in the past two legislative sessions, that would place an embargo on the interisland movement of Hawaii grown commodities.

In addition, increasing research creates opportunities to maintain mature export markets, and varieties within the state. The secondary benefit will allow more scientific research to be accomplished in Hawaii, and hopefully inspire students to seek higher education in agricultural and other scientific fields. At one time, similar to pineapple and sugar, the world came to Hawaii to obtain the best new varieties of orchids and anthuriums.

A healthier overall floral industry will allow the industry to consistently produce high-quality floral products. If the research and marketing are linked, the hope is to reduce the importation of floral products and decrease the potential risk of importing more invasive species. Based on commodities destroyed by the Department of Agriculture, certain commodities have a higher potential for the transport of invasive species into the State. A significant portion of imported cut foliage and cut flowers have been designated as high risk for introduction of invasive species and are targeted for import replacement, and therefore, alternative replacement materials will be needed for the floriculture industry. Some of these high-risk flower and foliage materials are already grown in the State, and a focused effort is needed to develop them as locally grown replacements that are competitive in price, quality, consistency, and availability.

Flower and foliage farmers and nursery operators.

Statewide, as HFNA membership is over 300 farms and nurseries statewide, of various sizes.

This strategic plan will also include the development of the clean export program, to reduce the amount of pests leaving the farm or nursery on a commodity.

B. Clean Export Program

Given lack of effectiveness by the biosecurity program over the last several years, more pests are and will be impacting the farms and nurseries. Once established in the State or any island, these pests infest our farms and nurseries, and are sometimes spread by hitchhiking on our exported commodities. Our members have been penalized by the introduction of new pests into the State through export restrictions, destruction of commodities due to pest infestation, and increased inspection and quarantine measures, and adding tremendous labor and operating costs to reduce infestation levels.

Scope of Work:

Based on the research and pilot program completed by the Hawaii Department of Agriculture, create pest management strategies for selected nurseries as a pilot project.

- Determine pest(s) of significance
- Develop plan for pest management focusing on pest(s) of significance
- Plan implementation
