The Hawaii Korean Cultural Center ("HKCC") is a Domestic Nonprofit Corporation incorporated in July 2007 with the purpose of establishing the Korean Cultural Center in Hawaii to share and promote the Korean Culture to the people of Hawaii.

Despite Hawaii being a very important place of Korean immigration history, there is no Korean Cultural Center in Hawaii yet. We believe that Hawaii should have a facility such as the Hawaii Korean Cultural Center to share with locals and visitors alike what an impact the presence of Korean immigrants in Hawaii has had in shaping and enriching the culture of Hawaii. Such a cultural center would carry an important meaning not only for residents of Hawaii, but also for Korean residents in America, as well as Korean nationals abroad.

2. The goals and objectives related to the request;

The HKCC seeks state funding at this time for capital to be used toward the construction of the Center, funds granted to HKCC would be used to toward the establishment of the Center, including and not limited to such expenditures as developing/procuring land, fundraising, planning, construction, legal expenses, and any and all expenses reasonably related to furthering the mission of establishing a Korean Cultural Center in Hawaii.

3. The public purpose and need to be served;

The HKCC seeks to provide a gathering place for the local community to hold events and teach the local community about Korean culture and history by:

- 1. Promoting and assisting education of Korean language and culture for the future generations
- 2. Promoting and assisting education for 1st generation Korean immigrants
- 3. Providing a place for professional and public services to all people in Hawaii
- 4. Providing a place for cultural events and assembly for the Korean and other

community groups in Hawaii

- 5. Providing a place of public information for Koreans about living in American society.
- Describe the target population to be served; and

The focus is to serve the Korean community in Hawaii and share Korean culture with other community as well as the visitors to Hawaii. The Center would be open and welcome all groups as a place for gathering and cultural enrichment.

5. Describe the geographic coverage.

The HKCC seeks to build a cultural Center in a central location on Oahu; In November 2015, HKCC purchased property at 3075 Kalihi Street in Honolulu, Hawaii and is undergoing examination as to the feasibility of using this site as the final location for the Center.

## II. Service Summary and Outcomes

At this initial stage, the scope of the work is focused on fundraising to gather the capital required to secure the land, pay off the underlying mortgage on the property, and begin construction of the Center once the mortgage loan is paid off. These responsibilities are primarily in the hands of the volunteer Board of Directors and will eventfully require the assistance of contractors and other hired third parties to complete the work.

2016 to 2018: Continue fundraising efforts (Annual Golf Tournament and Taste of Korea); develop and improve property purchased at 3075 Kalihi Street on preparation for conversion to Headquarters for the future Center or for the Center itself.

- 2019-2020: Pay off the underlying mortgage of \$2,100,000.00 and start the plan to demolish and build, or renovate the current structure to be used as the Center.
- 2021-2022: Start the actual construction of a new building or renovate the current structure to be used as the Center.

2023: Open the Center to the public

3. Describe its quality assurance and evaluation plans for the request. Specify how the applicant plans to monitor, evaluate, and improve their results; and

The HKCC Board of Directors will set annual fundraising goals to use as benchmarks.

At this time the HKCC Board of Directors seeks capital to build and construct the Center, there is no Programming to report at this stage. But HKCC can provide an accounting of the funds appropriated. The requested grant-in-aid would be used to allow the board to explore opportunities to build the center. In November 2015, HKCC purchased a property at 3075 Kalihi St. in Honolulu, Hawaii with a mortgage in the amount of \$2,100,000. If HKCC receives the grant-in-aid, we could pay off the mortgage and start to build the Center at 3075 Kalihi St. Once the Center is open, it will be open to all people in Hawaii as well as the tourists visiting Hawaii. It will offer educational, cultural and historical exhibits about Korea, especially about the Korean immigrants who came to Hawaii starting in 1903 as sugar cane laborers. It will also provide cultural events and entertainments for all people, Hawaii residents and visitors, to enjoy and appreciate. The Center will offer a banquet space for anyone to host a first birthday luau or special events. Basically, the Center will serve as the gathering place to share Korean history, language, culture and tradition to all people in Hawaii.


