 Hilo Bayfront Trails, Inc. is a non-profit organization, incorporated in 2012 and comprised of volunteer community members dedicated to the implementation of a complete trail network and its supporting elements as envisioned in the Hilo Bayfront Trails Master Plan.
- 2. The goals and objectives related to the request;
 We are building a Trail that will make our town proud... for locals to enjoy and visitors to admire! The Hilo Bayfront Trails project will transform and beautify our town by providing a recreational and scenic trail system in the heart of Hilo's uniquely open and public spaces. We envision the trail as a pathway ... to not only showcasing the natural beauty of our Hilo hometown, but also to improve the health, fitness, historic preservation, cultural celebration and sense of pride of our community.

The Trail will provide over 6 miles of a variety of multimodal paths, pedestrian sidewalks, dedicated bicycle lanes, and shared roads for bicycles that will function as a cohesive trail system for pedestrian and non-motorized transportation between Hilo Harbor and Downtown Hilo.

It will complement and highlight the outstanding attributes of the Hilo Bayfront area: the dramatic views of Hilo Bay and Mauna Kea, Farmer's Market, Mo'oheau Bandstand, the soccer fields, Wailoa State Park, Lili'uokalani Park, Reed's Bay, Banyan Drive, Suisan Marketplace.. and beyond. It will create increased accessibility and connectivity to our beaches, the downtown area, parks and recreational spaces, points of historical interest, and venues for cultural and community events. It will also enhance opportunities for more recreational activities in and throughout these scenic areas. Aside from the trails themselves, the project will include new parking areas and interpretive signs and displays denoting areas of historical and cultural interest.

The Hilo Bayfront Trails project is being developed section by section as funding becomes available (see map below). The entire system may be envisioned as a series of lei, linked in loops and tying together our community's history, scenery, recreational activities and the exquisite open space areas fronting Hilo Bay.



The public purpose and need to be served;

Market studies also suggest that the trails will attract tourists to enjoy the beauty of Hilo. We envision micro enterprises being able to take advantage of the trails by renting bicycles and even Segways for visitors to use as they explore Hilo Town.

It is envisioned that visitors from cruise ships will be more inclined to stay in Hilo and spend dollars on local restaurants, accommodations and retail purchases if there is a convenient way to get around Hilo without having to rent a car.

The trails are also expected to increase property values. A home near a trail can offer a pleasing view, quieter streets, recreational opportunities and a chance to get in touch with nature. Studies find that properties located near trails generally sell for five to thirty-two percent more than those farther away.

Trails also strengthen the social fabric of a community. Volunteering is one measure of the vitality of a society. People working together, giving their time freely, and sharing in socially valuable, meaningful activities— these are practices that create strong communities.

Our trail will be largely built by volunteers, such as the members of trail clubs and other not-for-profit organizations. Our community will be vested in its own asset! Trail construction and maintenance builds and solidifies partnerships among community groups, businesses, property owners, local government, community residents and trail club members.

4. Describe the target population to be served; and Recognizing the important role of physical activity in promoting healthier lifestyles, the idea for the Hilo Bayfront Trails project began as a dream in 2006. Ten years later, it is becoming a reality through an innovative partnership with Hawaii County, local business leaders and the community to create a safe path that makes physical activity something everyone can access and enjoy.

The trails are designed for walking, cycling and jogging. Once completed, they will provide physical activity for the widest range of people, including persons with disabilities, children and youth, the elderly and others who are known to be less physically active.

5. Describe the geographic coverage.

The 6 plus miles of trail will connect over 700 acres of land throughout the Hilo Bayfront Area and eventually to Hilo Harbor.

Hilo Bayfront Trails was recently awarded a \$511,000 grant to complete Phase I of the project which includes one mile of trail to be laid spanning from Mooheau Park to Pauahi Street and from Pauahi Street to the Hilo Bayfront Park canoe sheds and then to the Kumu Street terminus around the soccer fields to Pauahi Street.

Construction of Phase I is expected to begin in Spring of 2016 and completed by December 2016.

An all-volunteer board led by attorney and business owner Peter Kubota will be in charge of the project.


In addition, Dr. Ron Terry who is an environmental, planning and land use consultant is overseeing the trails project. Dr. Ron Terry earned his BA in geography at UH Hilo in 1980, and went on to earn a PhD in 1988 from Louisiana State University. He was an associate professor at UH Hilo from 1989-1992, developing a reputation for excellence as a teacher in geography and environmental sciences.

In 1991, Terry started a successful independent consulting firm, Geometrician Associates. In 2000, then-Governor Ben Cayetano appointed Terry to the State's Marine and Coastal Zone Advocacy Council (MCZAC), a public advisory body that addresses coastal issues and advocates for the State's Coastal Zone Management Program initiatives. He has provided his environmental expertise pro bono to a number of community initiatives, including forest stewardship, Hawaiian farming rights, cultural learning and community facilities. Geometrician Associates supports the arts as a long-term corporate sponsor of the Hawai'i Concert Society.

Other members of the volunteer board include realtors, a Captain in the Hilo Fire Department and urban planners.
