I. BACKGROUND AND SUMMARY

1. A brief description of the applicant's background

Ka Lailima Ho'omalua is a subsidy for the NSW (Neighborhood Security Watch). Ka Lailima Ho'omalua is a non-profit organization that brings awareness to our communities about the prevention of Crime and to give back the Hope of instilling safety in our communities to improve quality of life. As volunteer members of the Kanehili Hawaiian Homestead Community, located in Kapolei, Hawaii, we have identified key leaders and volunteers who have taken the initiative to lead our organization in this direction to accomplish our objectives and maintain a safe and secure community. The Kanehili Neighborhood Security Watch (KNSW) was organized in 2010 under the HPD (District 8) Community Policing as volunteers to our community. In 2014 we filled for our 501C3 IRS Federal exemptions to be able to help supply the West Oahu NSW groups with the equipment's that are needed in our daily patrols.

Through our years of patrolling, our groups were limited to uniforms (tee-shirts). HPD (Honolulu Police Department) will supply our first initial Citizen Patrol tee-shirts, which is limited to the NSW groups. We have joined up with other NSW groups within the District 8 area and it is best to have all the NSW groups wearing the same tee-shirts to be recognized in all of our communities.

Our plans include: To purchase golf carts for our NSW Captains in the different communities to help alleviate the walks during night patrol hours. We would like to supply our groups with tee-shirts, construction safety vest, flash lights, also we would like to get safety cones, for the different activities we do in our communities.

Ka Lailima Ho'omalua manages the scheduling of the communities monthly patrols through a calendar that's created by our Directors. Each NSW Captain holds a monthly patrol with our District 8 HPD Officer, at this time the community comes out to do a monthly community walk with our Officer. In between the other scheduled weeks are patrolled by volunteer members of the NSW, and by doing so, the scheduled patrols are consistent every week in a month.

2. The goals and objectives related to the request:

Project Goal:

Bringing awareness to our communities in planning a great and safe environment for our present and future families. Acknowledging our Volunteers on a yearly basis. Providing safety classes for the communities.

Project Objective:

3. The Public purpose and need to be served;

The **purpose** is to bring down the crime activities in our communities, without being the eye's and ear's for our HPD Officers, it is impossible for our Officers to be in every community at the same time as needed. Our HPD staff is limited to each Officer in District 8, with the help of our community volunteers, as being visible in all the different communities in Kapolei will help bring down the crime statistic.

4. Describe the target population to be served;

Total Population in Kapolei 15,186

5. Describe the geographic coverage

The geographic coverage of this project includes the West Oahu (District 8) Community Policing from Makaha to Ewa Beach, right now our focus is with-in the Villages of Kapolei, and East Kapolei (Senate District #19, House District #42,)

II. Service Summary and Outcomes

1. Describe the scope of work, tasks and responsibility;

Scope of work:

Organized groups of neighborhood residents who watch out for criminal and suspicious behavior and report it to our local law enforcement help prevent crime and promote cooperation among residents and police. Our Organization will coordinate a calendar system for these NSW groups for their monthly patrols.

Tasks:

Community Problem Addressed, every day, neighborhood across the Islands confronts any number of property and violent crimes and threats of crime. This strategy attempts to provide our local enforcement with additional eyes and ears to watch out for all types of criminal activity and promote Neighborhood security. Community crime watches can address all types of crime, but our primary focus is typically residential burglary and other crimes around the home, such as larceny and vandalism. Our presence can also help deter criminals who would attempt to conduct drug- or gang – related activities in the

neighborhood. Our Organization will send out daily/weekly ALERTS to notify the communities of any suspicious crime related activities.

Responsibilities:

Our responsibilities are to identify key leaders or persons most concerned about crime in the neighborhood and organize a meeting of these individuals to discuss safety. The Police will be invited to a neighborhood meeting to discuss community safety, and volunteers can be solicited to serve as block watch leaders. A communication network will be organized to pass along information about crime and security to residents. We will have our Police providing training on recognizing and reporting suspicious activity and on home and neighborhood security. The watch may expand to foot or car patrols. We will provide a variety of safety programs to the communities.

2. Projected annual timeline

- a. Every Month an NSW Calendar will be submitted to the active NSW groups (see attachments).
- b. Monthly employment checks will be conducted; payments will be made monthly

3. Describe quality assurance and evaluation plans for the request.

Ka Laulima Ho'omalua Board of Directors and staff is committed to serve the active NSW groups of West Oahu to help improve their patrols in a coordinated and safer environment. Our request for golf carts are greatly needed for each NSW Captain for their community to be able to alleviate the hours of walking and use a golf cart to patrol in their communities.

Should KLH organization receive any grant funding from the GIA grant program it would be used to fund all our program needs for equipment to be used for the programs. KLH volunteer staff has a strong reputation of being effectiveness because we work along with the Honolulu Police Department (HPD), in training and to promote safety in the assigned communities. Currently, we do not have any funding nor equipment i.e. golf carts is an important measure to be able to travel in the sub-districts while volunteers do patrolling.

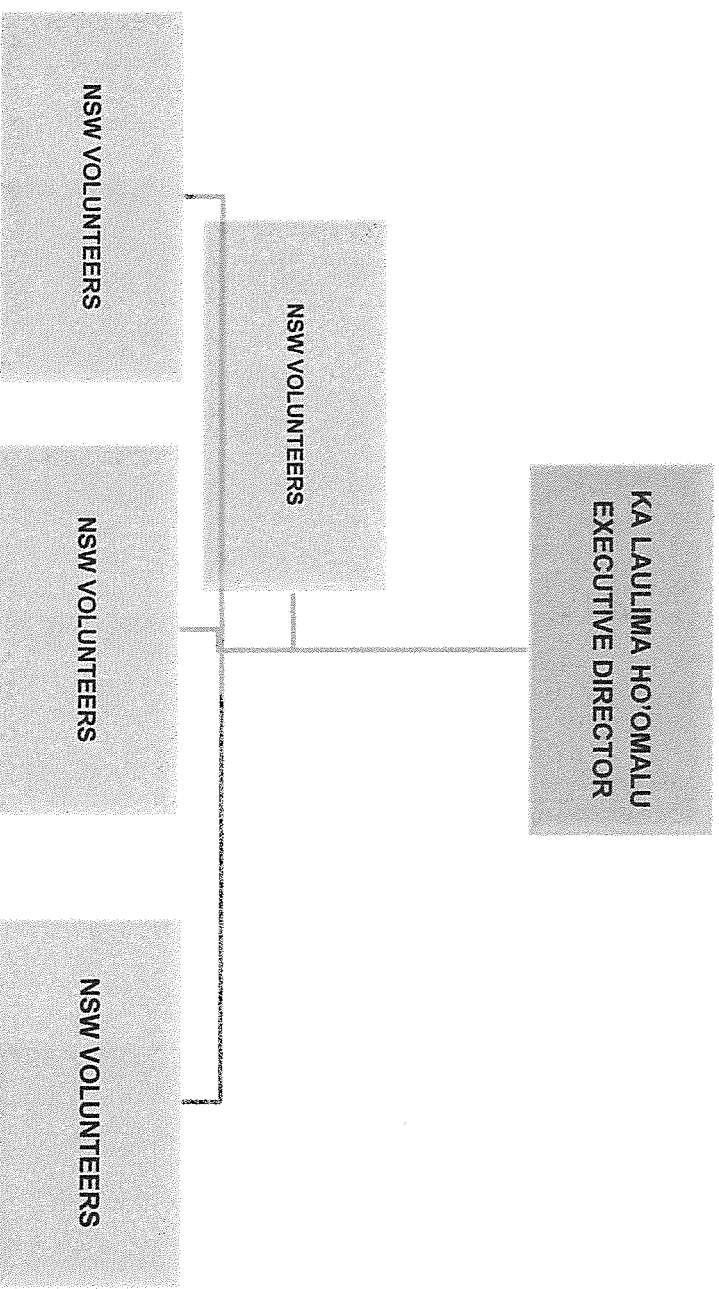

Na Maka o Ka Po'e: The Eyes of The People

Neighborhood Watch volunteers are helping to keep our Villages safe.

If you're up to no good in the wee hours of the night and you feel like someone is watching you...they probably are.

The Neighborhood Security Watch (NSW) is one of 12 community programs sponsored by the Honolulu Police Department. The goal of the NSW is to increase public education, awareness and prevention of local crime in the community. There are approximately 10 Neighborhood Watch (NW) groups in Kapolei that are taking initiative to stop crime before it gets out of hand and it is proving to be successful.

They aren't rough and tough vigilantes; instead they are caring, honorable residents dedicated to protecting their 'ohana, friends and neighbors. They work hand-in-hand with HPD and have gained great respect in the community.

The Kanehili Homestead NW group is one of the standout forces of Kapolei. "Captain" Ruth Kepo'o and "Overseer" Jodi Akau are the leaders of the pack. Kepo'o, 72, is a grandmother of eight by day and crime stopper by night. The group was established in 2010 due to the rampant drug problems ravaging the area. They started with nearly 60 volunteers but five years later they are down to only a handful of members ranging in age from 12 to 80 years old. Those that remain go the extra mile and have even formed a splinter group, the Citizens Patrol (CP), and take to the streets on foot looking for suspicious activity. On occasion, they ride the bus into Kapolei town where they couple-up and set out in separate directions to patrol.

Most NW groups meet once per month but Kanehili CP gathers as often as duty calls—even if that means crawling out of bed at 1 a.m. Often, the security guards at the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands building call the NW coordinators in the middle of the night for their assistance on patrol. This particular bunch prefers to be 'out and about' after midnight anyway, yet they carry no weapons for self-defense, they say they are not scared for their safety.

"Nothing can happen to us unless God says so," says Kepo'o with a smile.

The NW promotes non-confrontation and believes that generating visibility can be enough to prevent unlawful activity. Officer Tanya Fiaseu has been working side by side with the Kanehili group for four years now and vouches that they are the "eyes and ears" of the area.

Kanehili CP carries radios and wears bright blue or yellow, self-designed 'Citizens Patrol' T-shirts. Hanging around their necks are HPD-blue, blinking glow sticks. Believe it or not, this is enough to discourage many nefarious characters from completing a late night drug run or make teenagers who are 'smoking something funny' scatter. When notified of a suspicious location, the NW club stands just off the property and documents all the happenings by taking photos, writing down license plates and any other relevant details.

"I'm applying for a 501 (c)(3) so we can get funding to get all of us golf carts because we do a lot of walking," says Akau. They also wish to acquire vests and flashlights.

In the future, NW groups hope for larger participation from local residents. The Kanehili bunch is covering as much territory as possible but more manpower is desired. They represent at numerous community activities like marching in city parades, painting graffiti walls and helping keiki cross streets before school in order to promote awareness.

All residents are encouraged to help. The need for extra eyes is there and the deep friendships built through the program are important. The volunteers are a proud, admirable troop and get a thrill reminiscing over past busts and ongoing accomplishments. ●
