A brief description of the applicant's background;

Pacific Historic Parks (PHP) is a non-profit cooperating association that supports and funds educational and interpretive programs for the National Park Service (NPS) and State Park sites within Hawaii and the Pacific.

PHP was founded in 1979 as the *Arizona* Memorial Museum Association. Over the years, the organization has expanded to include other large parks to encompass WWII Valor in the Pacific National Monument at Pearl Harbor; Diamond Head State Monument on the island of Oahu; Kalaupapa National Historical Park on the island of Molokai; American Memorial Park on Saipan; and War in the Pacific National Historical Park on Guam.

In 1987, PHP entered an agreement with the NPS to support and fund education programs, museum displays and exhibits, and interpretive programs at Kalaupapa National Historical Park. The organization was selected because of their successful past experience in working with NPS at the USS *Arizona* Memorial (part of WWII Valor in the Pacific National Monument at Pearl Harbor).

PHP's unique hybrid business model consists of traditional nonprofit fundraising along with a strong retail component. This has provided stable income and allowed the organization to successfully cover its operational and administrative costs so that received donations can be fully applied to program services.

Currently PHP employs approximately 70 individuals, including one in Kalaupapa – Uncle "Boogie," a former patient who operates the bookstore. The Board of Directors provides direction and vision. The President & CEO is responsible for operations. PHP is organized into departments: Education, Membership, Publications, Marketing, Bookstore, Audio, Development, Accounting, and Human Resources.

2. The goals and objectives related to the request;

Kalaupapa is a small remote community on the island of Molokai, located on Kalaupapa Peninsula at the base of some of the highest sea cliffs in the world. The area, originally the site of a Hawaiian fishing village, is known for its breathtaking scenery.

In 1866, during the reign of Kamehameha V, the Hawaii legislature passed a law that resulted in the designation of the Settlement as a quarantine colony for Hansen's disease (leprosy) patients. At the time, the disease was mistakenly believed to be highly contagious and incurable. More than 8,000 men, women, and children were in exiled to this island prison.

Father Damien settled there in 1873, followed by Mother Marianne Cope in 1888. Both were canonized as Saints by the Catholic Church in recent years for their inspirational service to the community.

The isolation law remained in effect until 1969, when it was finally repealed. Although modern medicine has rendered the disease curable and there are no active cases of leprosy in the colony, many of the residents were physically scarred by the disease to an extent that would make their integration into mainstream society difficult, if not impossible. Today, about 11 former patients continue to live there.

Kalaupapa National Historical Park was created in 1980 in part to honor and remember the legacy of Father Damien and those he served in the midst of suffering, and often times, the triumph of the human spirit over great adversity. Kalaupapa National Historical Park is the only known NPS site associated with a saint.

PHP is seeking funds for two projects:

1) Bayview Historic Preservation & Asbestos Removal - \$80,000

The historic Bayview complex is a neighborhood at Kalaupapa that was once home to several patients with advanced stages of Hansen's disease. It is one of the settlement's most elaborate expressions of the plantation style. It consists of two large detached buildings and three buildings joined by covered porches.

Bayview #1, a dormitory, was partially rehabilitated in FY14 using National Park Service funds and labor. However, during the repair process, asbestos was found in the plumbing under the building that halted all ongoing and planned historic preservation projects.

Bayview #5 is the first Bayview building that can be viewed by visitors after exiting the trailhead. It is in significant decline and poses health and safety risks. It is presently occupied and used as housing. Once the asbestos is removed, foundation work and structural repairs need to be made in order to stabilize this building and operations.

Asbestos abatement for health and safety reasons is needed immediately on all Bayview complex buildings in order to move forward with preserving and protecting these

buildings for future generations. Attempts to secure funding for abatement through the NPS has been an ongoing challenge, and the completed rehabilitation work on the buildings will be lost if the asbestos isn't removed soon due to further deterioration. The buildings will be used for interpretation and volunteer housing.

2) Pali Trail Hazardous Material Removal - \$20,000

The old Kalaupapa Lookout at Palaau State Park at the top of the Pali Trail is the only location in the park where staff can interact with visitors younger than 16. The area also serves an entryway to the park for most visitors - those entering on foot or by mule. An old metal pre-fabricated shed in the area and associated hazardous material (HAZMAT) is hampering the development of the gardens and outreach facility. Immediate removal of the shed and its contents is sorely needed for health and safety reasons and to improve aesthetics at the main portal to the park.

3. The public purpose and need to be served;

First and foremost, the physical state of the two sites pose an eminent danger to the current occupants and visitors. Remediation would ensure the health and safety of these people.

The labor for the repair work will be locally sourced and will contribute to the entire island economy.

Learning about Kalaupapa's history will preserve and promote a greater appreciation and understanding for Hawaii culture to all visitors. It will also increase respect for the park environment, by encouraging conservation and preventing ecological degradation.

- 4. Describe the target population to be served; and
- 5. Describe the geographic coverage.

The main target population to be served includes the residents and estimated 60,000 visitors to Kalaupapa per year.

Unless invited by a Kalaupapa resident, visitors are currently limited to 150 per day and must been older than 16, out of respect to remaining former patients. All tours must be booked through the exclusive operator, Damien Tours. The exception is the Kalaupapa Lookout which is the only area of the park open to all visitors without restrictions and the site of the HAZMAT Removal Project we are requesting funds for, which would restore the area back to full accessibility.

However, NPS is already making plans make the park more accessible as it transitions from servicing patients to the public and anticipates increased pilgrimages from religious visitors. These projects will lay the foundation for serving a much greater population, regardless of age, nationality, or physical handicap.

PHP has successfully worked with NPS since its inception in 1979. PHP lead a fundraising effort for eight years and oversaw the construction contracts for a new Pearl Harbor Visitor Center at the WWII Valor in the Pacific National Monument (USS *Arizona* Memorial), which held its grand opening on December 7, 2010.

The facilities includes a centralized ticketing desk for all Pearl Harbor attractions, an Education & Research Center, a giftstore, renovated theaters, and two museum galleries with state-of-the-art, interactive exhibits. The site experienced an immediate 20% increase in attendance following the year after opening from the year prior to construction. The USS *Arizona* Memorial continues to be the number one visitor attraction in Hawaii, with approximately 1.7 million visitors a year.

The NPS is a bureau of the US Department of the Interior. Their mission is to preserve unimpaired the natural and cultural resources and values of their parks for the enjoyment, education, and inspiration of this and future generations. The As the custodians of Kalaupapa National Historical Park since December 22, 1980, it is NPS' primary duty to provide a well-maintained community that ensures the present residents may live out their lives peacefully and comfortably.

B. Facilities

The facilities consist of the five historic homes in Bayview, a complex that originally included dormitories and a dining hall for infirm patients, and a metal pre-fabricated shed at the top of the Pali Trail. We are seeking funds to improve all these structures.

Executive oversight will be provided by Aileen Utterdyke. Aileen has served as the Vice President & CFO for PHP since 2012, overseeing the entire financial strategy and stewardship of the organization. She briefly served as Interim CEO, when the federal government entered a 16-day shutdown in October 2013. She successfully saw the organization through the period without incurring any layoffs despite a full closure of Pearl Harbor.

Prior to PHP, Aileen worked as a consultant and was the Tax Senior Manager at Ernst & Young for over 20 years. She is Certified Public Accountant and the

author of "Taxes of Hawaii: A Comprehensive Guide for Taxpayers and Tax Professionals."

Aileen will work directly with Erika Stein Espaniola, NPS Superintendent for Kalaupapa. Erika has been Superintendent for the past several years and worked at the park for more than five years prior. She began as an Archaeologist, then as the Cultural Resource Program Manager.

Erika has grown the cultural resource program at Kalaupapa, as well as its interpretation and education program. Among her accomplishments are her work with the Hawaiian Legacy effort to perpetuate traditional knowledge and her involvement with with local student groups. She was also was part of the planning team for events celebrating the canonization of Saints Damien and Marianne.


