I. Background and Summary

1. A brief description of the applicant's background;
Storybook Theatre of Hawai'i (STH) was founded in 1979 and provides educational programs developed by professional artist educators through venues of the performing & visual arts, internet & television media, and live events. The stated Mission of STH is: *The sharing of cultural diversity; encouraging global understanding and citizenship; promoting environmental and arts education; enabling children to experience and participate in the performing and media arts; and using the medium of broadcast television and the internet to empower and elucidate children and families, through stories and other means.*

The organization is led by a six-member Board of Trustees. STH engages six staff members and six volunteers who devote time to various projects on a weekly basis. STH is also fortunate to have 50-100 volunteers who donate time on an 'as needed' basis. The staff and volunteers are led by executive director Mark Jeffers, who has been serving Hawaii's children for more than 35 years.

STH produces the *Russell the Rooster Television Show* which airs on OC16 and OC 6 with an estimated market base of up to 800,000 viewers. The Show has enriched children in a wide array of areas, including environmental awareness, conflict resolution and Hawaiian culture. This year STH is incorporating an "Island Readers" component into the program to advance family literacy throughout Hawai'i.

Other STH regular program offerings to the Kaua'i community include the annual Princess Ka'iulani Keiki Fest, Inflatable Humpback Whale School Tour, Forest Akamai Education Camp, Children's Corner Bookstore with Expression Session Saturdays, the Hanapepe Walk and Talk-Story Tour, and the *Children's Garden for Peace*.

2. The goals and objectives related to the request;
Goal: Provide educational programming to 3,000 children and 400 adults in a safe and welcoming facility in 2017.

Objective: In 2016-17, STH will hire a contractor to conduct termite extermination, including tenting the facilities to exterminate the current termite population and treatment with sentricon to prevent future infestation.

Objective: In 2016-17, STH will hire contractors to repair and replace the mounting for the indoor theatre seating, which has been structurally compromised due to termite damage.

Objective: In 2016-17, STH will oversee repair and replacement of rotting wood on window frames and repainting of the front façade and the exterior walls of the building.

Objective: In 2016, STH will oversee 3 volunteer workdays to complete work such as interior painting, exterior staining of the fence, as well as other minor maintenance.

Objective: In 2016-17, additional outdoor lighting, low voltage electric panel box and signage will be installed to improve visitor experiences in the Children's Garden.

Goal: Preserve and honor the history of the Sun Ke Heong building in Hanapepe, Kaua'i.

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Objective: In 2016-17, additional outdoor lighting, low voltage electric panel box and signage will be installed to improve visitor experiences in the Children's Garden.

Goal: Reach children with programming who currently cannot participate in afterschool programs due to lack of transportation.

Objective: In 2016-17, STH will purchase a 12 passenger van and retain a licensed driver to pick up children from local schools and bring them to STH facilities.

Objective: In 2016-17, STH will transport 150 children from the local schools to STH facilities in Hanapepe to participate in afterschool programming.

3. The public purpose and need to be served;

STH headquarters is in dire need of repair. STH is located in a historic building on the main thoroughfare in Hanapepe, Kaua'i. The *Sun Ke Heong*, or 'House of Fragrance' building, was constructed in 1933 and is included on the Hawaii and National Registers of Historic Places. The building bears special cultural significance in that it was constructed by entrepreneurial Chinese immigrants who sought a better life than working on plantations.

The building was largely destroyed by Hurricane 'Iniki in 1992, but with help from the community, STH was able to save the building from demolition. In 1997, STH was awarded a 55-year lease from the Department of Land and Natural Resources of the State of Hawai'i. Since that time more than \$795,000 in public and private cash and in-kind contributions has been raised by STH and invested in the rehabilitation of the building.

During the rehabilitation, STH maintained the historic nature of the building wherever possible, including restoration of the front façade and original hung windows. STH is proud to have restored a culturally significant building that has its own story and, in doing so, also created an inviting space for children. However, historic buildings require periodic investments as they require work by skilled tradesmen to preserve the features and structure. These investments are immensely valuable over the long term, paying off over the life of the building. Over the past 15 years, STH has conducted regular maintenance of the building as

part of its general operations. But the time has come that STH must invest funds in more extensive improvements of the facilities. The historic wooden window frames and part of the façade are rotting; the building must be treated for termites, which have caused significant damage to displays and indoor theatre seating platform; and it is time for the exterior to be repainted to preserve the walls. If this work is not completed in 2016-17, the rot could become extensive, thereby compromising the safety and value of the building, as well as the value of donated funds already invested in the same. Additionally, work has been done to maintain and add value to the elaborate Children's Garden (with an Amphitheatre that serves as an outdoor classroom) over the years and STH wishes to improve visitor experiences with the purchase and installation of new interactive signage and lighting to highlight that work and the Spark Matsunaga statue.

Finally, STH seeks to purchase a twelve-passenger van to enable more children to participate in programs. STH would use this van to establish a pick-up arrangement with public and private schools on the south and west sides of Kaua'i. More than 2,000 children attend school on the south/west sides of Kaua'i and approximately 50% of those children qualify for the reduced or free school lunch program. Many students are not able to participate in clubs and programs because their parents are working and unable to transport the children to an off-school site. As noted by Paula Adams of Hawai'i Afterschool Alliance, "due to the high cost of living in Hawai'i, it is common for both parents to work, making afterschool programs an important part of taking care of our keiki. Afterschool enrichment programs are a wonderful solution, giving children access to the arts and music while keeping them safe and happy." STH seeks to bring enrichment programs to the children who need it most by purchasing a van and hiring a certified driver to pick the children up at school and bring them to STH facilities. The parents could then pick up the children at STH after the program offerings or at a convenient pre-arranged drop site.

4. Describe the target population to be served; and

STH serves children ages 2-18 and their families. There are approximately 15,000 keiki on Kaua'i and 300,000 in Hawai'i. (See <http://datacenter.kidscount.org/data/tables>). In the 2016-17 season (July-July) STH proposes to reach approximately 3,000 children and 400 adults with 'in house' programming within STH facilities. Additionally, up to 100,000 children will enjoy programming completed within the STH headquarters and brought to children in their home via cable television and the internet. 5,000 children will enjoy STH professional educational tours in elementary schools and pre-schools throughout the state of Hawai'i. Local school-age children will be invited to participate in 4 different afterschool programs at STH facilities during the 2016-17 school year. STH aims to have 500 students participate in the camps and

afterschool programming, with approximately 150 receiving transportation services from STH. Transportation will be provided free of charge, with priority given to students who would not otherwise be able to attend the programs.

5. Describe the geographic coverage.

STH facilities primarily serve children and families on the south and west sides of Kaua'i, while the traveling educational tours serve children on all islands. The cable television show serves children on every Hawaiian island, several U.S. mainland cities, and in Rarotonga, Cook Islands, with an estimated potential viewer base of 500,000. STH internet programming has an unlimited reach.

II. Service Summary and Outcomes

Where possible, labor not requiring special skills will be conducted by volunteers (with supervision and direction). STH has already contacted or will contact the following organizations to request donations of 'employee work days': American Savings Bank, the Kauai Community Federal Credit Union, the Kauai Government Employees Federal Credit Union, the Koloa Federal Credit Union and the Garden Island Federal Credit Union.

For the remaining work to be completed as part of the 2016-17 Preservation Project, STH will use contractors with reasonable bids who possess the requisite skill and experience to work on historic buildings. Where possible, STH has selected contractors who will donate a portion of the labor or materials. All work will be overseen by STH staff and the Board of Trustees. Specifically, the STH Board of Trustees has appointed 4 trustees to serve on a facilities committee, which will oversee all work relating to the Project.

2. Provide a projected annual timeline for accomplishing the results or outcomes of the service.

As a result of this work, more than 3,000 children and 400 adults will enjoy programs within safe facilities in the 2016-17 STH season (July-July). An additional 100,000 children will enjoy programming completed within the STH headquarters and brought to children in their home via cable television and the

internet. 5,000 children will enjoy STH professional educational tours in elementary schools and pre-schools throughout the state of Hawai'i.

A passenger van will enable STH to reach 2,166 students who attend school at Ele'Ele Elementary, Koloa Elementary, Kekaha Elementary, Kalaheo Elementary, Ni'ihau Charter Elementary, St. Catherine's Catholic School and Waimea Middle school. Those children will be invited to participate in 4 different afterschool programs at STH facilities during the 2016-17 school year. STH aims to have 500 students participate in the camps and afterschool programming, with approximately 150 receiving transportation services from STH. Transportation will be provided free of charge, with priority given to students who would not otherwise be able to attend the programs.

The STH facilities committee will oversee the progress and quality of work performed in the 2016-17 Preservation Project. The committee will meet every month during the progress of the work to discuss the scope, progress and quality of work conducted to date, as well as the scheduling and bids for future work. A final report will be compiled by the committee at the end of the 2016-17 season or upon completion of the work within the scope of the project, whichever occurs first. The facilities committee will enlist the help of neutral contractors to evaluate the quality of work when necessary.

STH receives a grant from the Hawaii State Foundation on Culture and the Arts for its 2016 fiscal year of \$7,621.

STH has a facilities committee, comprised of 4 members of the Board of Trustees, which oversee all maintenance, investiture, and repairs to STH headquarters. The facilities committee, along with executive director Mark Jeffers, successfully supervised a complete rehabilitation of the historic building and children's garden from 1997-2012. They sagely and frugally managed \$795,000 of community investment which transformed a building on the verge of destruction into the versatile facilities STH calls home today. STH has a state-of-the-art media production studio, an indoor theatre and filming area, classrooms, a welcoming area for children and families, and a beautiful outdoor garden with an amphitheater.

Having successfully rebuilt the entire building, the STH facilities committee and executive director are assuredly capable of overseeing the repairs which simply seek to preserve the work already completed.

B. Facilities

The historic building which serves as STH's facilities includes a children's theater, a professional quality media studio, a Children's Corner Bookstore, the Children's Garden for Peace, classrooms, and administrative offices. The Children's Garden features an outdoor amphitheater, gazebo, Japanese bridge, bronze statue of US Senator Spark M. Matsunaga, and stone waterfall/stream/pond. While the facilities are currently in need of repairs, once those repairs are completed as part of the 2016-17 Preservation Project, the facilities will be in stalwart condition, ready to serve Hawaii's children for many more years.

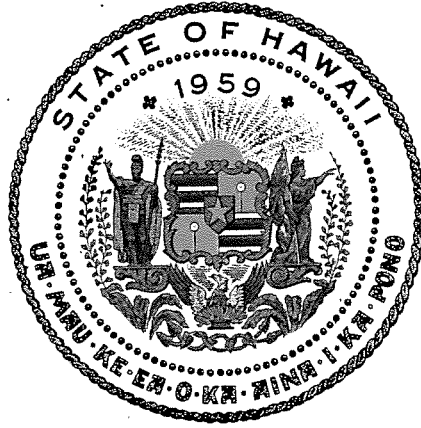

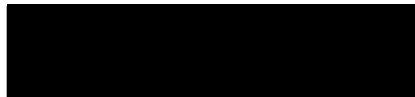
