I. Background and Summary

The Whitmore Economic Development Group (WEDG) was founded in 2013 with the mission of providing resources for a sustainable and diverse agricultural business community in the central Oahu region. WEDG, in partnership with the Agribusiness Development Corporation (ADC), Hawaii Asia Pacific Association (HAPA), and other organizations, is working to establish an agricultural regime defined by best practices, systems management, technological innovation, and regional branding.

WEDG is currently seeking a Capital Improvement Project Grant-In-Aid award of \$55,000 to create a business incubator that grows, nurtures, and sustains small businesses and economic development in the Central Oahu region though public and private partnerships. This incubator, located in the Whitmore Agribusiness-Tech Park, will host and house private organizations and public agencies that support small business owners and farmers with starting and/or scaling up their operations, spurring economic growth, increasing food security, and furthering efforts in the region thereby creating and establishing a sustainable and vibrant agricultural and food processing innovation center.

In creating this business incubator, we are implementing a successful business hub model that has been replicated not only within our state, but nationally and internationally. Project partners and advisors possess the expertise, technical experience, and industrial knowledge required to establish, initiate, expand and sustain our efforts.

WEDG is acutely aware that Hawaii is severely disadvantaged by its reliance upon a single industry (tourism) for economic sustainability during the 21st century. In the Central Oahu community of Wahiawa where pineapple once reigned as the most significant export crop produced, we recognize – with great urgency – the need for a fresh and diverse approach to agriculture with great potential to invigorate and rejuvenate economic growth and sustainability.

In 2009, Wahiawa was designated as a Neighborhood Revitalization Strategy Area (NRSA); thereby, recognizing and acknowledging that our community is significantly composed of low- to moderate-income households in dire need of economic revitalization. Our project will contribute to addressing this specific socio-economic need.

II. Service Summary and Outcomes

The CIP-GIA award of \$55,000 will support necessary repairs, renovation and upgrades to remaining portions of the former Dole Office building located within the new Whitmore AgriBusiness Tech Park. The current tenant, a representative from the Wahiawa Community-Based Development Organization, occupies a smaller, renovated portion of the building. It is anticipated that the majority of repair and renovation work will require three to six months, including appropriate electrical wiring and hi-speed fiber optic cable installation. As necessary, smaller repair/upgrade issues (i.e., patch and paint) will be ongoing. Renovations involve space design and allocation to include and not be limited to conference and meeting room(s), office machine hub, office supply pantry, individual work spaces and offices. Upon completion, WEDG will implement and facilitate a business incubator hub that grows, nurtures, and sustains small/start-up agriculturally related initiatives that support economic development in the Wahiawa-Whitmore community.

The renovation work will be a collaborative partnership with private contractor Andre Bungat, co-owner of 1st Choice Maintenance, LLC. The scope of work includes but is not limited to: (a) repairs to walls, doors, other flat surfaces; (b) termite damage repairs; (c) painting; (d) restorative flooring; and, (e) air conditioner installation. The contractual amount is \$30,000 and includes the cost of lumber, hardware and miscellaneous tools/apparatus, window glazing compound, and paint. \$10,000 is allocated toward the purchase of office equipment leasing contracts, air conditioning, and carpeting/floor covering. The remaining \$15,000 is allocated to WEDG partnership contribution toward re-roofing the entire structure, which is sorely in need of corrective work to ensure the integrity and overall value of the existing structure.

We propose quarterly funding in the respective amounts of: \$47,500, \$2,500, \$2,500 and \$2,500 for a total award amount of \$55,000 as provided in the enclosed budget form(s).

WEDG's proposed project is critical to the health and sustainability required to support and enhance the revitalization of Central Oahu's once vibrant agricultural standing. The 21st century is an opportune time to reinvigorate Hawaii's agricultural communities with diversity, technology, collaborative partnerships and visionary planning that is actionable and achievable. The capital improvement initiative that WEDG proposes toward the establishment of a recognized and replicable model of a business incubator hub is not only relevant, but crucial.
