A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOMELESSNESS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that many homeless
2	persons are known to thrive better when they have ready access
3	to familiar support groups or family members. In light of this
4	finding, the legislature enacted Act 222, Session Laws of Hawaii
5	2013, which in part authorized the department of human services
6	to establish a return-to-home pilot program. The return-to-home
7	pilot program was intended to ensure that those individuals who
8	find themselves homeless in the islands are able to reconnect
9	with support networks ready and able to receive them.
10	The purpose of this Act is to require the establishment of

- the return-to-home pilot program and extend its term for three more years.
- 13 SECTION 2. Act 222, Session Laws of Hawaii 2013, is
 14 amended by amending section 13 to read as follows:
- "SECTION 13. (a) The department of human services [may]

 16 shall coordinate a voluntary homeless assistance pilot program

 17 to be known as the return-to-home pilot program to provide

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- 1 eligible homeless individuals with assistance in being reunited
- 2 with family and relatives in the individual's home state. The
- 3 department [may] shall contract with eligible non-profit
- 4 organizations, for profit organizations, or foundations to
- 5 administer the pilot program.
- 6 (b) No individual who is homeless shall be eligible to
- 7 participate in the return-to-home pilot program unless:
- 8 (1) The individual's participation is completely
- 9 voluntary;
- 10 (2) The individual, if on parole, probation, or awaiting a
- 11 court hearing or sentencing, has proper clearance from
- the court to participate in the pilot program; and
- (3) The individual is indigent and lacks the financial
- 14 resources necessary to secure transportation to return
- to the individual's home state.
- 16 (c) An individual may participate in the return-to-home
- 17 pilot program only once and shall sign an agreement to this
- 18 effect before participating in the pilot program. The agreement
- 19 shall be kept on file with the pilot program.
- 20 (d) The return-to-home pilot program shall actively seek
- 21 the participation of local airlines, cruise lines, charter

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- 1 companies, homeless programs, travel agencies, and the visitor
- 2 industry to coordinate and implement the pilot program.
- 3 (e) The return-to-home pilot program shall assist program
- 4 participants with necessary and proper preparations for travel,
- 5 including obtaining proper identification, accessing public
- 6 transportation to the airport, providing orientation relating to
- 7 airport security, and ensuring sufficient personal hygiene.
- 8 (f) The return-to-home pilot program shall cease to exist
- 9 on December 31, [2016.] 2019."
- 10 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 11 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 12 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for the
- 13 implementation of the return-to-home pilot program, including
- 14 all program costs and hiring of necessary staff.
- The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 16 human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 17 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 18 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 19 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016.
