A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ABSENTEE BALLOTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 15-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
2	amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted			
3	and to read as follows:			
4	""Electronic transmission" means the transmission of a			
5	blank or voted ballot by facsimile, electronic mail delivery, or			
6	the utilization of an online absentee ballot delivery and return			
7	system, which may include the ability to mark the ballot."			
8	SECTION 2. Section 15-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
9	amended by amending subsection (e) to read as follows:			
10	"(e) When a registered voter requests an absentee ballot,			
11	the voter also may include an additional request to receive			
12	absentee ballots permanently. After receiving a request for			
13	permanent absentee voter status, the clerk shall mail to the			
14	voter who requested permanent absentee voter status an absentee			
15	ballot for all subsequent elections conducted in that precinct.			
16	The forwarding address for absentee ballots to be permanently			
17	mailed shall be the in-state mailing address contained in the			

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1	voter's registration record. Voters who seek to have ballots			
2	forwarded to another address shall apply for an absentee ballot			
3	under subsection (a). Permanent absentee voters may request			
4	under subsection (a) that their ballots be forwarded to another			
5	address either in or outside of the State for a single election			
6	or for a primary or special primary election and the election			
7	immediately following the primary or special primary election.			
8	A permanent absentee voter's request for a ballot to be			
9	forwarded temporarily under subsection (a) will not serve as a			
10	cancellation of the voter's permanent absentee status or as a			
11	change to the voter's permanent absentee mailing address. Upon			
12	the completion of the election or elections covered by the			
13	permanent absentee voter's request under subsection (a), the			
14	voter's permanent absentee mailing address on file with election			
15	officials will resume as the address to which the voter's			
16	ballots will be mailed permanently."			
17	SECTION 3. Section 15-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
18	amended by amending subsection (h) to read as follows:			
19	"(h) A voter's permanent absentee voter status, unless the			
20	voter resides in an area in which only absentee ballots may be			

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1	cast, shall be terminated if any of the following conditions		
2	apply:

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1 chapter 15D] may request that absentee ballots be forwarded by 2 [facsimile.] electronic transmission. Upon receipt of such a 3 request and confirmation that proper application was made, the 4 clerk may transmit appropriate ballots [by facsimile], together 5 with a form requiring the affirmations and information required 6 by section 15-6, and a form containing a waiver of the right to 7 secrecy, as provided by section 11-137. The voter may return 8 the voted ballots and executed forms by [facsimile] electronic 9 transmission or mail; provided that they are received by the 10 issuing clerk no later than the close of polls on election day. 11 Upon receipt, the clerk shall verify compliance with the 12 requirements of section 15-9(c) [7] and prepare the ballots for 13 counting pursuant to section 15-10[-]; provided that if the 14 voter returns multiple voted absentee ballots for the same election, the clerk shall prepare, for counting, only the first 15 16 absentee ballot returned that is not spoiled." 17 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 18 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 19 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2030.

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Report Title: Office of Elections Package; Absentee Ballots; Electronic Transmission

Description:

Allows a permanent absentee voter to receive ballots at an alternate address for elections within an election cycle. Clarifies that certain conditions that normally lead to a termination of permanent absentee voter status do not apply if the voter resides in an absentee voter only area. Replaces references to facsimile ballots with references to electronic ballots. Allows a voter to receive an absentee ballot by electronic transmission if the voter requires such a ballot within five days of an election, or the voter would otherwise not be able to return their properly issued ballot by the close of polls.
