

### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO IMMUNIZATION.

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#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 302A-1156, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows:

3 "§302A-1156 Exemptions. (a) A [child] student may be 4 exempted from the required immunizations:

- (1) If a licensed physician, physician assistant, or advanced practice registered nurse certifies that the physical condition of the [child] student is such that immunizations would endanger the [child's] student's life or health; or
- 10 (2) [If any parent, custodian, guardian, or any other 11 person in loco parentis to a child objects to 12 immunization in writing on the grounds that the 13 immunization conflicts with that person's bona fide 14 religious tenets and practices. Upon showing the 15 appropriate school official satisfactory evidence of 16 the exemption, no certificate or other evidence of 17 immunization shall be required for entry into school.]

3	SECTION 2. Section 325-34, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended to read as follows:
5	"§325-34 Exemptions. (a) Section 325-32 shall be
6	construed not to require the vaccination or immunization of any
7	person for three months after a duly licensed physician,
8	physician assistant, advanced practice registered nurse, or an
9	authorized representative of the department of health has signed
10	two copies of a certificate stating the name and address of the
11	person and that because of a stated cause the health of the
12	person would be endangered by the vaccination or immunization,
13	and has forwarded the original copy of the certificate to the
14	person or, if the person is a minor or under guardianship, to
15	the person's parent or guardian, and has forwarded the duplicate
16	copy of the certificate to the department for its files.
17	(b) [No] Except for students attending public schools, no
18	person shall be subjected to vaccination, revaccination or
19	immunization, who shall in writing object thereto on the grounds
20	that the requirements are not in accordance with the religious
21	tenets of an established church of which the person is a member

- 1 or adherent, or, if the person is a minor or under guardianship,
- 2 whose parent or guardian shall in writing object thereto on such
- 3 grounds, but no objection shall be recognized when, in the
- 4 opinion of the director of health, there is danger of an
- 5 epidemic from any communicable disease."
- 6 SECTION 3. If, prior to January 1, 2017, a:
- 7 (1) Public school student who has reached the age of
- 8 majority; or
- 9 (2) Parent, custodian, quardian, or any other person in
- 10 loco parentis to a public school student,
- 11 submits to the public school at which that student is enrolled a
- 12 written objection to immunization on the grounds that the
- 13 immunization conflicts with that person's bona fide religious
- 14 tenets and practices, the student shall be allowed to attend
- 15 that public school until the end of the 2016-2017 school year.
- 16 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 17 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 18 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2017;
- 19 provided that section 3 shall take effect on July 1, 2016.

Student Immunization

Requires all public school students to be immunized, except for cases in which the immunization would endanger the life or health of a child. Exempts students attending private schools and home schools from immunization requirement.

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
