## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. The legislature finds that licensed  
2 pyrotechnicians are required to obtain a permit to conduct  
3 outdoor and close proximity fireworks for theatrical purposes.  
4 While the permit fee has remained the same for thirteen years,  
5 the cost to process, review, and approve the permit application  
6 has increased. The legislature further finds that fees need to  
7 keep pace with administrative costs.

8           The purpose of this Act is to raise the fee for an aerial  
9 device, display fireworks, or articles pyrotechnic permit from  
10 \$110 to \$300.

11           SECTION 2. Section 132D-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
12 amended to read as follows:

13           "§132D-10 Permits. A permit shall be required for the  
14 purchase and use of:

15           (1) Any consumer fireworks commonly known as firecrackers  
16           upon payment of a fee of \$25;

1           (2) Any aerial devices, display fireworks, or articles  
 2           pyrotechnic for the purposes of section 132D-16 upon  
 3           payment of a fee of [~~\$110,~~] \$300; and

4           (3) Any consumer fireworks for the purposes of section  
 5           132D-5 or for cultural uses that occur at any time  
 6           other than during the periods prescribed in section  
 7           132D-3(1) upon a payment of a fee of \$25."

8           SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed  
 9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

10          SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
