A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR SENIOR CENTERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that senior centers in
- 2 Hawaii provide vital health education and screenings, fitness,
- 3 recreation, case management, and other services that enable
- 4 thousands of senior citizens to maintain wellness, support
- 5 independence, and avoid expensive institutional care. The
- 6 executive office on aging's 2013 Profile of Successful Aging
- 7 Among Hawaii's Older Adults notes that supportive relationships,
- 8 interactions with the environment, and engagement in social
- 9 activities have positive correlations with the well-being of
- 10 older adults.
- 11 The legislature further finds that senior centers are
- 12 accessible and popular places where Hawaii's kupuna may gather
- 13 for social engagement and physical activity that contribute to
- 14 their well-being.
- 15 The purpose of this Act is to provide funding for senior
- 16 centers, thereby enabling kupuna to participate in activities to

1	help them remain active, healthy, and independent in their
2	community.
3	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
4	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
5	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 to
6	provide funding for grants, pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii
7	Revised Statutes, for seniors centers and to be distributed as
8	follows:
9	(1) Catholic Charities Hawaii for the
10	Lanakila multi-purpose senior
11	center \$185,000;
12	(2) Kapahulu Center \$;
13	(3) Moiliili Community Center for the
14	Moiliili senior center \$60,000;
15	and
16	(4) Waikiki Community Center \$75,000.
17	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
18	health for the purposes of this Act.
19	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016.
