A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the affirmative
- 2 consent task force, established by Act 222, Session Laws of
- 3 Hawaii 2015, reviewed and made preliminary recommendations on
- 4 the University of Hawaii executive policy regarding sexual
- 5 harassment, sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence,
- 6 and stalking.
- 7 The legislature finds that this issue is a matter of
- 8 statewide concern that falls under its purview pursuant to
- 9 article X, section 6, of the Hawaii State Constitution.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to adopt the preliminary
- 11 recommendations of the affirmative consent task force.
- 12 SECTION 2. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended by adding a new section to subpart A of part I to be
- 14 appropriately designated and to read as follows:
- 15 "§304A- Campus safety and accountability. (a) The

The University of Hawaii shall 6 submit a report to the legislature no later than twenty days 7 before the convening of each regular session that shall include: 8 (1) A summary of the most recent campus climate survey 9 results; 10 (2) Information on the number of sexual assaults that 11 occurred on a University of Hawaii system campus 12 within the past five years; and 13 (3) Recommendations and efforts to improve campus safety 14 and accountability. 15 (f) The University of Hawaii shall establish policies and 16 procedures to effectuate this section." **17** SECTION 3. (a) No later than December 31, 2016, the University of Hawaii shall revise, as necessary, all University 18 19 of Hawaii executive policies regarding: 20 (1) Student conduct;

(2) Nondiscrimination;

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- 1 (3) Complaint procedures;
- 2 (4) Campus security;
- 3 (5) Alcohol consumption;
- 4 (6) Housing; and
- 5 (7) Workplace nonviolence,
- 6 that conflict with any University of Hawaii executive policy
- 7 regarding sexual harassment, sexual assault, domestic violence,
- 8 dating violence, and stalking, including University of Hawaii
- 9 executive policy number 1.204.
- 10 (b) The University of Hawaii shall enter into memoranda of
- 11 understanding with all county police departments by December 31,
- 12 2016, to govern communications and procedures for addressing
- 13 sexual assaults that occur on University of Hawaii system
- 14 campuses.
- 15 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 16 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 17 begun before its effective date.
- 18 SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
- 19 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2525.

Report Title:

Affirmative Consent Task Force; Campus Safety; Sexual Assault

Description:

Requires UH to train employees and students on sexual harassment policies, appoint a campus advocate at each campus for students to discuss incidents of sexual harassment, report sexual assault cases to the police, and conduct a campus climate survey. Prohibits romantic relationships between, among others, a UH student and a UH faculty member. (HB2772 HD1)

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
