
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PENALTIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 291E-62, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

3 "(b) Any person convicted of violating this section shall
4 be sentenced as follows without possibility of probation or
5 suspension of sentence:

6 (1) For a first offense, or any offense not preceded
7 within a five-year period by conviction for an offense
8 under this section, section 291E-66, or section 291-
9 4.5 as that section was in effect on December 31,
10 2001:

11 (A) A term of imprisonment of not less than [~~three~~
12 ten consecutive days but not more than thirty
13 days;

14 (B) A fine of not less than \$250 but not more than
15 \$1,000;

16 (C) Revocation of license and privilege to operate a
17 vehicle for an additional year; and



1 (D) Loss of the privilege to operate a vehicle
2 equipped with an ignition interlock device, if
3 applicable;

4 (2) For an offense that occurs within five years of a
5 prior conviction for an offense under this section,
6 section 291E-66, or section 291-4.5 as that section
7 was in effect on December 31, 2001:

8 (A) [~~Thirty~~] A term of imprisonment of not less than
9 thirty days [~~imprisonment,~~] but not more than
10 sixty days;

11 (B) A \$1,000 fine;

12 (C) Revocation of license and privilege to operate a
13 vehicle for an additional two years; and

14 (D) Loss of the privilege to operate a vehicle
15 equipped with an ignition interlock device, if
16 applicable; and

17 (3) For an offense that occurs within five years of two or
18 more prior convictions for offenses under this
19 section, section 291E-66, or section 291-4.5 as that
20 section was in effect on December 31, 2001, or any
21 combination thereof:

- 1 (A) One year imprisonment;
- 2 (B) A \$2,000 fine;
- 3 (C) Permanent revocation of the person's license and
- 4 privilege to operate a vehicle; and
- 5 (D) Loss of the privilege to operate a vehicle
- 6 equipped with an ignition interlock device, if
- 7 applicable."


8 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
9 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
10 begun before its effective date.

11 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
12 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

13 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
