
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that protecting Hawaii's
2 consumers from false or fraudulent advertising is essential to
3 ensuring a fair market for all businesses and competitors. Many
4 plastic products are now compostable and biodegradable and thus
5 do not remain as trash when discarded. However, other products
6 have been deceptively marketed to consumers as compostable and
7 biodegradable. These products are actually composed of between
8 thirty-four to ninety-seven per cent plastic, which eventually
9 breaks down into microplastics, which cannot be seen or cleaned
10 up and which have been found to accumulate in organisms and
11 animals, thereby endangering the food chain.

12 The legislature further finds that ensuring truth in
13 advertising and differentiating between compostable products and
14 non-compostable products is crucial to protecting our
15 environment, ensuring a fair business market, and protecting
16 Hawaii's consumers.



1 The purpose of this Act is to join other states that
2 already require plastic products marketed as biodegradable,
3 degradable, decomposable, or compostable, or in any way imply
4 that the product will break down, to meet the American Society
5 for Testing and Materials' specifications for compostability.

6 SECTION 2. Chapter 342H, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7 amended by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately
8 designated and to read as follows:

9 "§342H- Plastic products; labeling. (a) No plastic
10 products shall be labeled as "biodegradable", "degradable",
11 "decomposable", or "compostable", or any form of these terms,
12 unless they meet ASTM D6400.

13 (b) No plastic products shall be labeled in any way to
14 imply that they will biodegrade, decompose, break down, or
15 fragment in a landfill or other environment, unless they meet
16 ASTM D6400.

17 (c) Notwithstanding subsections (a) and (b), plastic
18 products that have been certified by the Biodegradable Products
19 Institute may be labeled using the Biodegradable Products
20 Institute's logo.



1 (d) A person who violates this section shall be fined
2 \$ for each separate violation. Each day the violation
3 continues shall constitute a separate violation.

4 (e) The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
5 91 to implement this section.

6 (f) As used in this section:
7 "ASTM D6400" means the specifications for compostability of
8 the American Society for Testing and Materials.

9 "Consumer product" means a product or part of a product
10 that is used, bought, or leased for use by a person for any
11 purpose.

12 "Plastic product" means a product made of plastic, alone or
13 in combination with other material. A plastic product includes
14 but is not limited to any of the following:

- 15 (1) A consumer product;
- 16 (2) A package or packing component;
- 17 (3) A bag, sack, wrap, or other product made of thin
18 plastic sheet film; or
- 19 (4) A food or beverage container, or a container
20 component, including a straw, lid, or eating utensil."

1 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
 2 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
 3 begun before its effective date.

4 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.

5 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2016.
