
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SCHOOL HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 51, Session Laws
2 of Hawaii 2004, sought to revamp education in Hawaii, in part,
3 by creating an interagency working group to develop plans for
4 transferring certain rights, powers, functions, duties, and
5 resources from various state departments to the department of
6 education. This interagency working group ceased to exist on
7 June 30, 2007.

8 The legislature further finds that the establishment of
9 such interagency working groups facilitates interagency
10 communication and in particular, will help address various
11 issues that either have not been fully resolved since Act 51 or
12 have arisen as a result of transfers implemented pursuant to Act
13 51.

14 The purpose of this Act, therefore, is to improve the
15 delivery of school health services by establishing an
16 interagency working group to create a comprehensive school
17 health program.



1 SECTION 2. (a) The department of education and department
2 of health shall jointly convene an interagency working group to
3 discuss and create a comprehensive school health program that
4 includes a comprehensive, sustainable plan to address, at a
5 minimum, issues relating to:

- 6 (1) The development of a school health program
7 infrastructure and a recommendation regarding the
8 department in which to place such a program to ensure
9 what is best for students attending department of
10 education schools;
- 11 (2) The transfer of health aides from the department of
12 health to the department of education;
- 13 (3) The training of department of education employees and
14 agents relating to the administration of medication to
15 students by the department of health;
- 16 (4) The identification of existing barriers and mechanisms
17 necessary to maximize all relevant and available
18 federal funds for services that may be offered through
19 the school health program; and



- 1 (5) Any personnel issues that may arise as a result of the
2 comprehensive plan, including the transfer of
3 personnel from one department to another.
- 4 (b) Members of the working group shall include:
- 5 (1) The superintendent of education or the
6 superintendent's designee, who shall serve as a co-
7 chair;
- 8 (2) The director of health or the director's designee, who
9 shall serve as a co-chair;
- 10 (3) A representative from the special education section of
11 the department of education's curriculum and
12 instruction branch;
- 13 (4) A representative from the comprehensive student
14 support services section of the department of
15 education's student support branch;
- 16 (5) A representative from the healthcare contracts and
17 reimbursement program of the department of education's
18 office of fiscal services;
- 19 (6) A department of education complex area superintendent
20 or principal, to be chosen by the superintendent of
21 education;



- 1 (7) The chief of the department of health's public health
2 nursing branch or the chief's designee;
- 3 (8) The chief of the department of health's family health
4 services division or the chief's designee;
- 5 (9) The administrator of the department of human services'
6 med-QUEST division or the administrator's designee;
- 7 (10) A representative from the American Academy of
8 Pediatrics, Hawaii chapter;
- 9 (11) A family representative of a child with special health
10 needs, to be chosen by the governor;
- 11 (12) A family representative of a child with general needs,
12 to be chosen by the governor;
- 13 (13) The dean of the University of Hawaii at Manoa's school
14 of nursing and dental hygiene or the dean's designee;
- 15 (14) The dean of Kapiolani community college's health
16 sciences department or the dean's designee;
- 17 (15) A representative from a federally qualified community
18 health center, to be chosen by the governor;
- 19 (16) A representative from Papa Ola Lokahi;



1 (17) A former innovative zone health care coordinator from
2 the department of education, to be chosen by the
3 superintendent of education; and

4 (18) Any other person the superintendent of education and
5 director of health deem necessary for the success of
6 the working group.

7 (c) The working group shall submit an interim report of
8 its findings and recommendations, including any proposed
9 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
10 to the convening of the regular session of 2016. The interim
11 report shall, at a minimum, include:

12 (1) A finalized list of the membership of the working
13 group;

14 (2) Information on the progress made toward developing the
15 infrastructure of a school health program with a
16 comprehensive, sustainable plan;

17 (3) A proposed work plan, timelines, and responsible
18 parties therefor; and

19 (4) Recommendations concerning processes to maximize
20 applicable federal matching funds for services
21 provided through the school health program.



1 (d) The working group shall submit a final report of its
2 findings and recommendations, including any proposed
3 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
4 to the convening of the regular session of 2017. The final
5 report shall include all findings:

6 (1) Concerning the infrastructure necessary to establish a
7 comprehensive, sustainable school health program; and

8 (2) Related to a sustainability plan with quality
9 assurance and quality improvement parameters,
10 including specific performance measures and goals for
11 continued sustainability.

12 (e) No member of the interagency working group shall be
13 made subject to chapter 84, Hawaii Revised Statutes, solely
14 because of that member's participation as a member of the
15 interagency working group.

16 (f) The interagency working group shall cease to exist on
17 December 31, 2016.

18 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
