DEPARTMENT: Health.

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO HEALTH.

PURPOSE: To extend the date by which the Department

of Health must post inspection reports for state-licensed care facilities by six months and increase the number of days after the completion of the inspection to post the reports, as recommended by a working group on licensed care facilities authorized by Act 213, Session Laws of Hawaii (SLH) 2013.

MEANS: Amend section 321-1.8, Hawaii Revised

Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION: The amendments postpone mandatory posting of

inspection reports until July 1, 2015, and will allow the department to limit the posting of inspection reports to a single type of health care facility to identify and correct any unanticipated posting irregularities or complexities before posting reports on other types of facilities. Inspection criteria and reporting procedures vary widely among types of licensed care facilities, so limiting posting to a single type, yet to be determined, will allow the Department of Health to implement online posting in a

Increasing the number of days to post inspection reports from five business days to thirty calendar days will allow facilities the added time to submit plans of correction that can be posted with the inspection reports.

staggered manner and as resources allow.

The amendments postpone the requirement that inspections be posted as of July 1, 2015 due to evolving and ongoing discussions with the
