
HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING A CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO ESTABLISH FIXED TERMS FOR JUSTICES OF THE SUPREME COURT OF THE UNITED STATES.

1 WHEREAS, Article II of the United States Constitution
2 provides that the United States President shall appoint Justices
3 to the Supreme Court "by and with the advice and consent of the
4 Senate"; and
5

6 WHEREAS, Article III of the Constitution provides that
7 Supreme Court Justices "shall hold their offices during good
8 behavior," which has been interpreted to mean that Supreme Court
9 Justices may serve for the remainder of their lives unless they
10 resign, retire voluntarily, or are removed by impeachment; and
11

12 WHEREAS, lifetime judicial tenure provides Supreme Court
13 Justices with tremendous power and influence; and
14

15 WHEREAS, advances in science, medicine, and technology have
16 made it possible for Justices to serve much longer than in the
17 era of the Framers; and

19 WHEREAS, between 1789 and 1970, Justices served a
20 cumulative average of 14.9 years on the Supreme Court before
21 retiring; and
22

23 WHEREAS, Justices retiring between 1970 and 2005 served an
24 average of 26.1 years on the Court; and

26 WHEREAS, the last four Justices to leave the Court served
27 there for an average of twenty-eight years; and

29 WHEREAS, lifetime judicial tenure makes the timing of
30 appointments to the Court completely arbitrary; and

1 WHEREAS, throughout American history, some Presidents have
 2 had the opportunity to appoint several Justices while others
 3 have appointed none; and

4
 5 WHEREAS, judges do not enjoy lifetime tenure on
 6 constitutional courts of any other major democratic nation; and

7
 8 WHEREAS, creating a prospective system of fixed,
 9 nonrenewable, staggered, eighteen-year terms for Supreme Court
 10 Justices would create regular vacancies and allow each President
 11 to influence the composition of the Court; and




 13 WHEREAS, under the proposed system of fixed terms, a
 14 vacancy would occur on the Court every two years, allowing every
 15 one-term President to appoint two Justices and every two-term
 16 President to appoint four; and

 18 WHEREAS, many legal scholars agree that establishing a
 19 system of fixed terms for Supreme Court Justices would require
 20 an amendment to the United States Constitution; now, therefore,

21
 22 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
 23 Twenty-eighth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular
 24 Session of 2016, that the members of Hawaii's congressional
 25 delegation are urged to introduce legislation proposing an
 26 amendment to the Constitution of the United States to establish
 27 a prospective system of fixed, nonrenewable, staggered,
 28 eighteen-year terms for Justices of the Supreme Court of the
 29 United States; and

 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this
 32 Resolution be transmitted to each member of Hawaii's
 33 congressional delegation.
