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1 SECTION 2. The appropriations made for the capital
2 improvement projects authorized by this Act shall not lapse at
3 the end of the fiscal year for which the appropriations are
4 made; provided that all moneys from the appropriations that are
5 unencumbered as of June 30, 2018, shall lapse as of that date.

6 SECTION 3. The sums appropriated for the respective
7 capital improvement projects set forth in section 1 shall be
8 expended by the appropriate expending agency for the purposes of
9 this Act.

10 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2015.
