A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 103D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by adding a new section to part IV to be appropriately
3 designated and to read as follows:

4 "§103D- Single-serving bottled water; prohibition on
5 using state funds to purchase. (a) Notwithstanding sections
6 103D-102(b)(3), (b)(4)(H), and (b)(4)(L) and 103D-305 to the
7 contrary, no state agency shall use state funds for the purchase
8 of single-serving bottled water, except as provided in
9 subsection (b).

10 (b) The following circumstances shall constitute
11 exceptions to subsection (a):

12 (1) Public health and safety preparedness, emergencies,
13 investigations, and extended deployments or
14 activations of the office of hazard evaluation and
15 emergency response of the department of health or the
16 department of defense;



1 (2) Situations where there is high risk of cross-
 2 contamination with non-potable or contaminated water;
 3 or
 4 (3) Situations where there are no reasonable alternatives
 5 to bottled water, such as large public events and when
 6 large quantities of water may need to be distributed
 7 for health and safety reasons.

8 (c) For purposes of this section:
 9 "State agency" means a department, division, agency,
 10 office, board, commission, bureau, or council of the State.

11 "State funds" means any money deposited into or drawn from
 12 the state treasury or any special or trust fund of the State.

13 "State funds" includes any money appropriated by the State and
 14 transferred to any state agency that is used by the state
 15 agency, in whole or in part, to purchase goods or services."

16 SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.

17 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
