A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CAMPAIGN FINANCE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
2 by adding a new section to part XIII to be appropriately
3 designated and to read as follows:

4 "§11- Large contributions; report; legislators. (a) An
5 incumbent candidate seeking election to the senate or the house
6 of representatives, or the treasurer of the candidate committee
7 of the incumbent candidate, shall file a large contribution
8 report using the commission's electronic filing system within
9 ten days of receiving a contribution of an amount aggregating
10 more than \$500 from any person during a session of the
11 legislature.

12 (b) The large contribution report shall include the
13 following information:

14 (1) Name, address, occupation, and employer of the
15 contributor;

16 (2) Name of the incumbent candidate or candidate committee
17 receiving the contribution;

- 1 (3) The amount of the contribution;
- 2 (4) The contributor's aggregate contributions to the
- 3 incumbent candidate or candidate committee; and
- 4 (5) The purpose for which the contribution will be
- 5 applied, if any.
- 6 (c) A large contribution report filed pursuant to this
- 7 section shall be in addition to any other report required to be
- 8 filed by this part."

9 SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.

10 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
