# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WATER AUDITS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The commission on water resource management
2	shall establish a five-year program to provide technical
3	assistance to public water systems to conduct standardized water
4	audits of public water systems in accordance with the method
5	adopted by the American Water Works Association's Water Audits
6	and Loss Control Programs, Manual of Water Supply Practices -
7	M36, as amended.
8	In the first two years, the commission shall establish a
9	program for the counties to conduct standardized water audits of
10	public water systems operated by the counties. In the following
11	two years, the commission shall extend the program to all
12	remaining large capacity public water systems and public water
13	systems in designated water management areas.
14	In establishing the program, the commission shall utilize
15	the American Water Works Association's Free Water Audit
16	Software, Version 5.0 or subsequent versions. The program
<b>17</b>	elements shall include water audit training workshops, level 1

- 4 SECTION 2. The standardized water audits shall follow the
- 5 key parameters for establishing a water audit outlined in the
- 6 American Water Works Association's Water Audits and Loss Control
- 7 Programs, Manual of Water Supply Practices M36, as amended,
- 8 including:
- 9 (1) Describing the distribution system boundaries to
- identify all water sources supplying water to the
- 11 system, calculate the system input volume, and
- 12 calculate the volume of water supplied into the
- distribution system;
- 14 (2) Setting time periods for the audit that are sufficient
- to allow analysis and evaluation of the system water
- supply;
- 17 (3) Establishing standardized units of measure so supply
- and consumption units are the same;
- 19 (4) Assembling records and data from a wide variety of
- operations in the water systems, including:

1	(A)	Water supplied, including volume from own					
2		sources, and water imported or exported;					
3	(B)	Authorized water consumption, including billed					
4		metered, billed unmetered, and unbilled metered;					
5	(C)	Water system data, including length of mains,					
6		number of service connections, average length of					
7		customer service lines, and average operating					
8		pressure; and					
9	(D)	Cost data, including total annual cost of					
10		operating the water system, customer retail unit					
11		cost, and variable production costs; and					
12	(5) Iden	tifying, quantifying, and assigning costs to					
13	appa	rent losses and real losses.					
14	SECTION 3	. On January 1, 2017, the commission shall					
15	implement the water audit program developed pursuant to section						
16	1 and 2 of thi	s Act, and shall include a process for level 1					
17	validation of	water loss audit reports which follows the					
18	principles and terminology in the American Water Works						
19	Association's	Water Audits and Loss Control Programs, Manual of					
20	Water Supply Practices - M36, as amended, including the Free						
21	Water Audit Software wergion 5 0 or subsequent wergions						

- 1 The commission shall provide the counties and other
- 2 operators of public water systems subject to this Act the
- 3 technical assistance and information necessary to help prepare
- 4 and validate the water loss audit reports.
- 5 SECTION 4. Beginning in 2018, and for each subsequent year
- 6 thereafter, the counties shall submit, on July 1 of each year, a
- 7 completed and validated water loss audit report for each public
- 8 water system operated by the counties for the previous calendar
- 9 year to the commission. Beginning on July 1, 2020, and for each
- 10 subsequent year thereafter, all remaining large capacity public
- 11 water systems and public water systems in water management areas
- 12 shall submit, on July 1 of each year, a completed and validated
- 13 water loss audit report on their water systems for the previous
- 14 calendar year to the commission. Each water loss audit report
- 15 submitted to the commission shall be accompanied by information
- 16 identifying steps taken in the preceding year to increase the
- 17 validity of data entered into the final audit, reduce the volume
- 18 of apparent losses, and reduce the volume of real losses.
- 19 SECTION 5. As used in this Act:
- 20 "Commission" means the commission on water resource
- 21 management.

1 "Designated water management area" means a geographic area 2 that has been designated pursuant to section 174C-41, Hawaii 3 Revised Statutes. 4 "Large capacity public water system" means a public water 5 system that serves a population of one thousand or more. 6 "Level 1 validation" means a water audit that has been 7 subject to a third-party desktop review of data that is 8 immediately available, which may include supply reports, 9 consumption reports, and testing reports. "Level 1 validation" 10 includes utility staff interviews with third-party validators 11 focused on outlining organizational practices to ensure that 12 data validity scores have been assigned correctly and 13 consistently, and confirmed, corrected, or noted as needing 14 further investigation. 15 "Public water system" means a system subject to Federal 16 Safe Drinking Water Act regulations, which provides water for human consumption through pipes or other constructed 17 18 conveyances. Such a system includes any collection, treatment, 19 storage, and distribution facilities under the control of a 20 utility and used primarily in connection with the system.

- 1 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 to
- 4 establish and implement the program to conduct standardized
- 5 water audits of public water systems in accordance with this
- 6 Act.
- 7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the commission on
- 8 water resource management for the purposes of this Act.
- 9 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

#### Report Title:

#### Description:
