# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE JOINT FORMULARY ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the joint formulary advisory committee established by the department of commerce and 2 consumer affairs should be repealed because it is obsolete and 3 4 unnecessary in recommending the applicable formulary for 5 advanced practice registered nurses with prescriptive authority. The board of nursing is the authority that determines the 6 7 qualifications and scope of practice of advanced practice 8 registered nurses with prescriptive authority, and the board is already the authority that determines the applicable formulary 9 10 or exclusionary formulary for licensees under its authority. If 11 necessary, the board of nursing may consult with other boards, such as the board of pharmacy or Hawaii medical board, on 12 questions pertaining to prescription drugs. Other resources, 13 14 such as the National Council of State Boards of Nursing, also

have information on other states' nurse practice acts.

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1	The purpose of this Act is to repeal the joint formulary
2	advisory committee established by the department of commerce and
3	consumer affairs.
4	SECTION 2. Section 457-8.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended to read as follows:
6	"§457-8.6 Prescriptive authority for advanced practice
7	registered nurses. (a) The board shall grant prescriptive
8	authority to qualified advanced practice registered nurses and
9	shall designate the requirements for advanced nursing practice
10	related to prescriptive authority. The board shall determine
11	the exclusionary formulary for qualified advanced practice
12	registered nurses who are granted prescriptive authority.
13	[(b) The department of commerce and consumer affairs shall
14	establish a joint formulary advisory committee composed of:
15	(1) Two persons licensed as advanced practice registered
16	nurses and appointed by the board;
17	(2) Two persons-licensed in medicine by the Hawaii medical
18	board and appointed by the Hawaii medical board;
19	(3) Three persons licensed as pharmacists and appointed by
20	the board of pharmacy;

15		nutritional, diagnostic, and supportive services
16		including home health care, hospice, and physical and
17		occupational therapy."

### Report Title:

Repeal; Joint Formulary Advisory Committee; Board of Nursing

### Description:

Repeals the Joint Formulary Advisory Committee established by the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs. Allows the Board of Nursing to be the sole authority that determines the exclusionary formulary for qualified advanced practice registered nurses with prescriptive authority. Effective 7/1/2112.
