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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE  
TWENTY-FOURTH SENATORIAL DISTRICT.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. The director of finance is authorized to issue  
2 general obligation bonds in the sum of \$24,394,500 or so much  
3 thereof as may be necessary and the same sum or so much thereof  
4 as may be necessary is appropriated for fiscal year 2016-2017  
5 for the purpose of financing capital improvement projects for  
6 the twenty-fourth senatorial district, as follows:

7       1. Ahuimanu elementary school, Oahu

8           A. Expansion of the administration

5            SECTION 2.    The appropriation made for the capital  
6    improvement projects authorized by this Act shall not lapse at  
7    the end of the fiscal biennium for which the appropriation is  
8    made; provided that all moneys from the appropriation  
9    unencumbered as of June 30, 2018, shall lapse as of that date.

10           SECTION 3.    The sum appropriated in section 1 shall be  
11    expended for the purposes of this Act; provided that the  
12    department of education shall be the expending agency for items  
13    1 through 14; provided further that the department of defense  
14    shall be the expending agency for item 15.

15           SECTION 4.    This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016.
