
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC AGENCY MEETINGS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 92-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 "§92-4 **Executive meetings.** (a) A board may hold an
4 executive meeting that is closed to the public upon an
5 affirmative vote, taken at an open meeting, of two-thirds of the
6 members present; provided the affirmative vote constitutes a
7 majority of the members to which the board is entitled. A
8 meeting closed to the public shall be limited to matters
9 exempted by section 92-5. The reason for holding such a meeting
10 shall be publicly announced, and the vote of each member on the
11 question of holding a meeting that is closed to the public shall
12 be recorded[7] and entered into the minutes of the meeting.

13 (b) Any discussion or final action taken by a board in an
14 executive meeting shall be reported to the public when the board
15 reconvenes in the open meeting at which the executive meeting is
16 held; provided that in describing the discussion or final action
17 taken by the board:



1 (1) The information reported shall not be inconsistent
2 with the purpose for which the executive meeting was
3 convened pursuant to section 92-5, including matters
4 affecting the privacy of individuals; and

5 (2) The board may maintain confidentiality for the
6 information described in paragraph (1) for as long as
7 disclosure would defeat the purpose of convening the
8 executive meeting."

9 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
10 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

11 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2030.

Executive Meeting; Public Agency Meeting

Description:

Requires a public agency board to report any discussion or final action taken during an executive meeting; provided that such disclosure is not inconsistent with the purpose of convening the executive meeting, but giving the board discretion to maintain confidentiality. (SB652 HD2)
