SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE EXECUTIVE OFFICE ON EARLY LEARNING TO COLLABORATE
WITH THE EXECUTIVE OFFICE ON AGING TO ENCOURAGE CARE
PROVIDERS OF KEIKI AND KUPUNA TO CREATE INTERGENERATIONAL
SHARED SITES FOR THE BETTERMENT OF HAWAII'S COMMUNITIES.

1 WHEREAS, keiki and kupuna are some of Hawaii's greatest
2 treasures; and

3
4 WHEREAS, Hawaii has a historic and cultural tradition of
5 valuing family and multigenerational living; and

6
7 WHEREAS, families are finding it increasingly more
8 difficult to provide for the care of their young children and
9 aging parents; and

10
11 WHEREAS, many kupuna experience social isolation, which can
12 lead to loneliness and depression as well as mental and physical
13 decline, while, at the same time, many keiki miss out on the
14 wisdom and patience of kupuna as families are more often forced
15 to live apart; and

16
17 WHEREAS, kupuna are currently undervalued in their capacity
18 to contribute to the community; and

19
20 WHEREAS, intergenerational shared sites are settings where
21 children, youth, and older adults participate in services and
22 programs concurrently at the same site or on the same campus;
23 and

25 WHEREAS, certain distinguished shared care sites in
26 Honolulu, Kapolei, and Kahului have had success in implementing
27 intergenerational programs; and

1 WHEREAS, participants in these intergenerational programs
2 interact during regular planned intergenerational activities, as
3 well as through informal encounters; and
4

5 WHEREAS, keiki and kupuna can learn values such as the
6 richness of lives lived, the bounds of friendship, an
7 appreciation of diversity, and insights into the different
8 stages of life from spending time together in intergenerational
9 shared sites; and
10

11 WHEREAS, working adults can also take advantage of the
12 efficiency and effectiveness of having shared care sites for
13 families; now, therefore,

15 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-eighth
16 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2016, the
17 House of Representatives concurring, that the Executive Office
18 on Early Learning is requested to collaborate with the Executive
19 Office on Aging to encourage care providers of keiki and kupuna
20 to create intergenerational shared sites for the betterment of
21 Hawaii's communities; and

23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
24 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of the
25 Executive Office on Early Learning and the Director of the
26 Executive Office on Aging.
