<u>SB 2390</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH. Authorizes a pharmacy to provide a customized patient medication package to any patient of an institutional facility or any member of the general public, subject to certain conditions.	CPH
<u>SB 2672</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSES. Amends various statutes to clarify the role of advanced practice registered nurses with regards to their authority and participation in the health care system. Amends definitions in the statutes to conform with the duties and responsibilities of advanced practice registered nurses.	CPH
<u>SB 2885</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO BIRTH DEFECTS. Clarifies the use of the birth defects data to include health care providers.	CPH
<u>SB 2523</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO MEDICAL MARIJUANA. Allows medical marijuana production centers to be greenhouses, shade houses, and open-air growing operations, provided that they are not visible from any thoroughfare.	CPH
<u>SB 3009</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO MEDICAL MARIJUANA. Amends the definition of "debilitating medical condition" to allow for greater physician discretion to prescribe low potency medical marijuana.	CPH
<u>SB 2389</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH. Broadens the scope of health and health care data and other information submitted to SHPDA.	Pending re-referral to CPH
