<u>HB 1669, HD2</u> <u>(HSCR947-16)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO PUBLIC ACCOUNTANCY. Redefines "peer review" to include reviews done by out-of-state public accountancy licensees. Increases deadlines for filing of peer review compliance reporting forms and appealing certain ratings from 10 days to 30 calendar days. Allows members of the public accountancy peer review oversight committee to be reimbursed for expenses. Protects the members from civil liability for actions done in furtherance of the purposes of the committee. Defines the term "Hawaii attest work". (HB1669 HD2)	CPH, WAM
<u>HB 1897, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR799-16)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO INSURANCE COVERAGE OF HEALTH SCREENINGS. Ensures insurance coverage for sexually transmitted disease screenings, including screenings for human immunodeficiency virus and acquired immunodeficiency syndrome. (HB1897 HD1)	CPH, WAM
<u>HB 2740, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR993-16)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO LIABILITY. Prohibits health insurance preauthorization requirements that cause undue delay in receipt of medical treatment or services. Specifies that insurers, but not health care providers, are liable for civil damages caused by undue delays for preauthorization. (HB2740 HD1)	CPH, JDL
<u>HB 1757, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR833-16)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH. Authorizes a pharmacy to provide a customized patient medication package to any patient of an institutional facility or any member of the general public, subject to certain conditions. (HB1757 HD1)	CPH, JDL
<u>HB 1852, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR701-16)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO WATER POLLUTION. Clarifies that nonprofit organizations may receive loans from the Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund to engage in activities that are consistent with the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, including the planning, designing, and construction of wastewater treatment works. (HB1852 HD1)	CPH, WAM

RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH.

Requires the family court to consider assisted community treatment as an alternative to commitment to a psychiatric facility for a person subject to a petition for involuntary hospitalization. (HB2559 HD1)
