<u>HB 2010, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR363-16)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO SPECIAL MINIMUM WAGES. Requires the Director of Labor and Industrial Relations to approve First Job Training Programs.	LAB, FIN
<u>HB 2007, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR364-16)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS. Establishes a Lean Government Advisory Board to make recommendations for improving state government efficiency.	LAB, FIN
<u>HB 2018</u> <u>(HSCR293-16)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO GOVERNMENT PROCESSES AND SERVICES. Establishes guidelines for the management of capital improvement projects.	LAB, FIN

<u>HB 2008, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR365-16)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT. Prohibits the State from hiring persons for more than two 89-day terms for a fully or partially general-funded position per lifetime of the person. Provides for limited exceptions.	LAB, FIN
<u>HB 2161, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR342-16)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE DISABILITY COMPENSATION DIVISION. Appropriates funds for the hiring of six identified hearings officer positions and support staff within the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations' Disability Compensation Division and to provide the officers and staff with legal and medical training. <u>HB 2715, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR186-16)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO WORKERS' COMPENSATION. Repeals HEMIC. Establishes a public corporation attached to DLIR to provide workers' compensation insurance. Requires employers to obtain worker's compensation insurance coverage only from the public corporation or be self-insured. Requires DLIR to create a transition and implementation plan for the established public corporation.	LAB, FIN
<u>HB 2053</u> <u>(HSCR43-16)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. Provides for the establishment of a special procurement process for the procurement of goods and services. Requires the establishment of procedures by the procurement policy board for use of the special procurement process.	EDB, FIN
<u>HB 2262, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR44-16)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HIGH TECHNOLOGY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION. Appropriates funds for the continuation of the manufacturing grant program, within High Technology Development Corporation.	EDB, FIN



<u>HB 2264, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR45-16)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HIGH TECHNOLOGY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION. Makes an appropriation to the High Technology Development Corporation for the provision of technology internship grants and development of programs to support the local talent pipeline for the technology industry.	EDB, FIN
<u>HB 2219, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR394-16)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO INNOVATION BUSINESS INTERACTION. Establishes a loan program in the HTDC to support dual-use technology small businesses. Appropriate funds.	EDB, FIN
<u>HB 2668, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR404-16)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HIGH TECHNOLOGY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION. Appropriates funds to continue the Small Business Innovation Research Program within the High Technology Development Corporation. Effective February 19, 2022.	EDB, FIN
<u>HB 2704, HD2</u> <u>(HSCR556-16)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CROWDFUNDING. Establishes exemptions from Hawaii securities law for limited intrastate investments with Hawaii businesses.	EDB, CPC, FIN

PAPER: 2 copies (including an original) to Room 306 in the State Capitol;


