<u>HB 1765, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR117-16)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CORAL. Requires UH to conduct a study on the effects of sunscreen on Hawaii's coral reefs. Appropriates funds. (HB1765 HD1)	OMH, HED, FIN
<u>HB 2240</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ENERGY AT THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII. Establishes the University of Hawaii green special fund within UH to reduce energy consumption and costs.	HED, FIN
<u>HB 2676, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR94-16)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. Establishes, within CTAHR's agribusiness incubator program, a five-year energy independent farming community pilot project. Appropriates funds. (HB2676 HD1)	AGR, HED, FIN
<u>HB 1758, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR134-16)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH. Appropriates funds to the John A. Burns School of Medicine to fund medical residency programs to help alleviate the shortage of primary care physicians in rural Oahu and neighbor island communities. (HB1758 HD1)	HLT, HED, FIN


