<u>HB 2090, HD2, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2983)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO LAND COURT. Streamlines the operations of the Office of the Assistant Registrar of the Land Court by removing the requirement that the Assistant Registrar certify uncertified certificates of title for fee time share interests. Effective 7/1/2030. (SD1)	CPH, JDL
<u>HB 2319, HD1, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2902)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO MONEY TRANSMITTERS. Amends requirements under the money transmitters law for money transmitter licensee change in control applications, including requiring a criminal history record check on persons who will assume control of the licensee. Updates a reference to federal Regulation E. (SD1)	CPH, JDL
<u>HB 2326, HD1, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2919)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO MORTGAGE RESCUE FRAUD. Makes numerous amendments to Hawaii's mortgage rescue fraud prevention act, chapter 480E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, for consistency with the federal Mortgage Assistance Relief Services Rule. (SD1)	CPH, JDL
<u>HB 2335, HD1, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2903)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO PHYSICIAN DISCIPLINE. Authorizes the Hawaii Medical Board to impose the same disciplinary action against a licensee as was taken by another state or federal agency. Establishes conditions for the disciplinary action. Prohibits the licensee from practicing until a final order of discipline is issued if the licensee has been prohibited from practicing in another state. (SD1)	CPH, JDL
<u>HB 939</u> <u>(SSCR2893)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO AMENDING IDENTITY OF REGISTRANT'S PARENT ON A BIRTH CERTIFICATE. Clarifies that amendments to birth records that change parenthood shall not be conducted through the Uniform Information Practices Act procedures to correct personal records, but must be pursuant to a court order of appropriate jurisdiction or other legal establishment of parenthood. <p><u>HB 1170, HD2, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR3126)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO LAND RESOURCES. Revises statutory provisions relating to the regulation of mineral resources under chapters 171 and 182, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to provide clarity and consistency. (SD1)</p>	<p>TRE/WLA, JDL</p>
<p><u>HB 1581, HD2, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR3083)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO JUDICIAL PROCEEDINGS. Requires contested case hearings of the commission on water resource management, land use commission, public utilities commission, Hawaii community development authority, and those involving conservation districts to be appealed directly to the supreme court. Requires the judiciary to submit a report to the legislature. Repeals on 7/1/2019. (SD1)</p>	<p>WLA/CPH, JDL</p>
<p><u>HB 2604, HD1, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR3000)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO THE ACQUISITION OF REAL PROPERTY. Clarifies that acceptance by the Territorial Legislature or the Legislature of a dedication of land in the Kakaako Community Development District by a private owner is sufficient to convey title to the State. Takes effect 7/1/2050. (SD1)</p>	<p>WLA, JDL</p>
<p><u>HB 799, HD2, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2883)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO THE UNIFORM AERONAUTICS ACT. Clarifies the authority of the State, its employees and its independent contractors to kill or attempt to kill wildlife by aerial means in furtherance of official State duties. (SD1)</p>	<p>WLA, JDL</p>
