 - a. I am committed to advancing and protecting the rights of children with serious emotional disturbances (SED), adults with serious mental illness (SMI), and adults with co-occurring SMI and substance use disorders (SUD).
 - b. As a family member to loved ones with SMI and SUD, I can appreciate the challenges and opportunities families face when supporting loved ones in different stages of recovery.
- (2) What do you perceive are the roles and responsibilities of a member of the Board?
 - a. Offer recommendations and guidance to the State Mental Health Authority (SMHA) in developing and implementing publicly-funded mental health services.
 - b. Monitor, review, and evaluate publicly-funded mental health services, including initiatives funded by the federal mental health block grant.
 - c. Monitor the SMHA for compliance to various HRS and HAR.

- a. All mental health consumers should have access to quality- and data-driven, outcomes-oriented, evidence-based, and promising practices in behavioral health that are recovery-focused, resiliency-oriented, trauma-informed, culturally-relevant, and holistic. I firmly believe that asking critical questions and providing honest feedback to receptive and reflective stakeholders (i.e., SMHA representatives) helps protect mental health consumers from potentially exploitive and paternalistic practices.
