**The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) supports Governor's Message 585, nominating Mr. Paul Morgan to the Hawai'i Historic Places Review Board expiring June 30, 2018.**

The Hawai'i Historic Places Review Board (Board) is established under Section 6E-5.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes. The Board orders and enters historic properties into the Hawai'i Register of Historic Places and evaluates and recommends nominations to the National Register of Historic Places.

Born and raised in Hawai'i, Mr. Paul Morgan received a Masters of Architecture from the University of Washington. Since 1991, Mr. Morgan has been a principal architect at Suzuki/Morgan Architects, where many of his projects have included preservation work. Mr. Morgan's research and presentations illustrate his expertise in the area of Hawaiian architectural history.

Mr. Morgan brings his working knowledge of architecture, and specifically his knowledge of architecture in Hawai'i, to this Board. Senate confirmation will ensure that Mr. Morgan's valuable knowledge and perspectives will assist in the deliberations of the Hawai'i Historic Places Review Board.
