Good morning Chair Agaran, Vice Chair Shimabukuro and members of the Committee on Judiciary and Labor. I am Allicyn Tasaka, Interim Executive Director of the Workforce Development Council (WDC) testifying in strong support of Marion Tsuji's confirmation to the WDC for a term to expire on June 30, 2018. Ms. Tsuji would fill a slot reserved for a workforce sector member on the Council.

The WDC is an attached agency to the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations and is responsible for advising the Governor and Legislature on workforce development to support economic development and employment opportunities for employers and employees. The WDC is the State Workforce Development Board for purposes of the federal Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) of 2014. The WDC assists the Governor in developing and updating comprehensive, strategic workforce development plans and oversees publicly funded workforce investmentment activities in the state.

Ms. Tsuji is President and Chief Executive Officer of Lanakila Pacific in Honolulu, Lanakila Pacific is a non-profit providing workforce training, life skills development, and meals on wheels to adults with disabilities. She also has extensive experience in the corrections industry in Hawaii and in New York and has served as Deputy Director for Corrections for the Hawaii Department of Public Safety (5/99-12/02).

Ms. Tsuji has served as Chair of the WDC for several years under the Workforce Investment Act which preceded WIOA. She has first hand knowledge of the Council and will bring historical

background and perspective.

Ms. Tsuji's experience in workforce training and her background in corrections will make her an ideal resource as WIOA includes ex-offenders returning to the community as "individuals with a barrier to employment." WDC will benefit from her unique set of experiences.

In this critical year, WDC has been preparing the WIOA Hawaii Unified State Plan. The plan covers the six core formula grant programs authorized under WIOA and outlines the state's vision and strategy for carrying out activities under each program. The WIOA plan is a Congressional mandate requirement in order for Hawaii to receive the bulk of federal funding for the State's primary job training and placement activities.

I respectfully urge you to confirm Ms. Tsuji as a member of the Workforce Development Council where he would be a valuable asset to the Council.
