Dear Chair Baker, Vice Chair Kidani, and members of the committee:

I am writing in strong support for Dr. Lori Karan to be approved as a member of the Hawaii Advisory Commission on Drugs and Controlled Substances. I have known Dr. Karan since she was the Medical Director for the Department of Public Safety and she serves on CHOW's Syringe Exchange Oversight Committee because of her expertise. As an addiction specialist, Dr. Karan has worked in a variety of settings where she has addressed substance abuse and its role in health-related issues.

The CHOW Project is dedicated to serving individuals, families, and communities adversely affected by drug use, through a participant-centered harm reduction approach. CHOW works to reduce drug related harms such as but not limited to HIV, hepatitis B/C and overdose.

I am currently the chair of the Hawaii Advisory Commission on Drugs and Controlled Substances and while I am not writing officially in that capacity, I can speak to the fact that we need more members with Dr. Karan's expertise in addiction. I hope you will recommend her appointment.

(1) Why do you want to be a member of the Board?

Heather Lusk Chairs the Hawaii Advisory Commission on Drug Abuse and Controlled Substances, and she requested that I apply. Heather Lusk is dedicated to improving services for addicted persons throughout Hawaii. I am delighted to support Heather in this work.

(2) What do you perceive are the roles and responsibilities of a member of the Board?

It is my understanding that the Hawaii Advisory Commission makes health policy recommendations concerning the availability, use, and abuse of alcohol, nicotine, tobacco, marijuana, methamphetamine, opiates, and other psychoactive compounds. This Advisory Commission may give important input to further the prevention, screening, diagnosis and treatment of chemical dependency.

(3) In what ways do you feel that you can help protect the consumer?

Consumers are best protected when they are educated, and when they have adequate knowledge to make informed decisions. There are many myths about psychoactive drugs and drug addiction. It is our role to combat this misinformation.

For instance, scientists are just beginning to understand the functions of the endogenous cannabinoid system. Marijuana will have medicinal uses as well as toxicities on an individual level, including effects on a person's cognition, emotions, and behavior. As other states decriminalize and/or legalize marijuana, we can learn from these experiences and share our findings with the citizens of Hawaii.

(4) Given your understanding of the roles and responsibilities of a Board member, why do you believe that you are qualified for the position? Please include a brief statement of your skills, expertise and knowledge that would aid you as a member of the Board.

I am a physician who is board certified in Internal Medicine and Addiction Medicine. From 2011-2015, I was Treasurer and Publications Chair of the American Society of Addiction Medicine.

My resume is attached.

(5) What do you hope to accomplish during your term of service?

I have no specific agenda. I want to prevent unnecessary suffering and improve public health whenever possible.

(7) Name a previous experience you've had that will be beneficial as a Board member.

I served on the Governor's Healthcare Transformation Task Force and helped formulate ideas to better serve different populations of high health service utilizers. I also reviewed this grant application and gave a detailed constructive critique prior to its submission.

(8) Can you foresee any possible conflicts of interest that could arise during your service on the Board? How would you overcome conflicts of interest?

I do not anticipate any conflicts of interest. If such a conflict arose, I would announce the conflict, give my input (that should be evaluated in light of my conflict), and then recuse myself from any decision-making.
