The Hawaii Primary Care Association (HPCA), which represents the federally qualified community health centers in Hawaii, supports House Bill 2348, restoring a second deputy director position to the Department of Human Services (DHS) as well as establishing other non-exempt positions.

As it currently stands, DHS has the largest operating budget of any state department, in total more than \$3B. In addition, they oversee the fifth largest staff of any department, with over 2,000 employees.

Cumulatively, these resources are used to provide a host of vital services to impoverished and underserved populations in Hawaii. In addition to administering the state Medicaid program, they also provide financial assistance, job training and placement, housing services, and aid for vulnerable children and adults.
