RE: H.B. 2501 H.D. 2 S.D. 1: Relating to Water Rights.

Dear Chair Tokuda, Vice-Chair Dela Cruz, and members of the Committee:

My name is Gladys Marrone, Chief Executive Officer for the Building Industry Association of Hawaii (BIA-Hawaii), the Voice of the Construction Industry. We promote our members through advocacy and education, and provide community outreach programs to enhance the quality of life for the people of Hawaii. BIA-Hawaii is a not-for-profit professional trade organization chartered in 1955, and affiliated with the National Association of Home Builders.

BIA Hawaii is in **strong support** of H.B. 2501 H.D. 2 S.D. 1, which would amend Chapter 171-58 HRS by allowing for a holdover permit to be issued to an applicant seeking to renew their water rights lease. The bill is necessary to allow for continuous, uninterrupted operations when an application has been made for a lease of a previously authorized disposition of water rights, for the operator to obtain a holdover permit, until such time as the pending application for the disposition of such water rights is finally resolved, even if such holdover period may exceed one year.

The proposed amendment would greatly assist in situations where the State is encouraging transitioning from one type of agriculture to another. The need for a supply of irrigation water is critical for any transition. Economically viable agriculture requires not only the availability of productive land but also water.

There is a need to understand that replacing plantation agricultural with other forms of agriculture is not a simple task. New agribusinesses may require different amounts of water for its crops. Additionally, having multiple users and operators present further challenges as the transition from one plantation system which operated and maintained the infrastructure on the plantation, to a situation where there maybe multiple users with no overall plan on who or how the infrastructure will be operated and maintained.

The State's record of transitioning from plantation agriculture to other forms of agriculture has not been successful if you were to look at the amount of former sugar and pineapple lands are still vacant and unproductive. Rather than rush to dismantle the planation and stop stream diversions, there is a need pause and give some thought to how to insure a successful transition to other forms of agribusinesses, or we face the prospect of having more vacant and unproductive agricultural lands.

The disposition of public resources such as water has become a contentious and volatile process. There is a need to keep the process open and competitive while at the same time balancing the need to reduce risks and provide some certainty as the State encourage the growth of new agribusinesses.

We appreciate the opportunity to express our strong support for H.B. 2501 H.D. 2 S.D. 1.

For years, Hawaii farmers have been maintaining proper irrigation and water usage throughout the islands. They have developed and preserved Hawaii's natural resources to better cultivate the land and support local residents.

Water rights are instrumental to the continued care Hawaii's farmers provide for agricultural land throughout the State. Installing a process to assist good stewards of the land contributes to the sustainability and future of agriculture in Hawaii.

The current lack of a definitive intermediary (hold-over) permitting or licensing process puts local farmers at undo risk. The potential for harm to agricultural entities throughout the state is something that should not be left unmitigated.

HB2501 provides the DLNR with a tool to issue permits in limited situations — when there was a previously authorized disposition of water rights, while an application for the re-disposition of those water rights is pending.

My Name is Lorie Farrell; I'm testifying today on behalf of Hawaii Farmers and Ranchers United. We strongly support HB 2501, this Bill affects all of Hawaii.

House Bill 2501 attempts to put in place temporary Legislative relief for all Revocable Permit holders who may be in jeopardy until DLNR can find a solution in that will benefit the public, farmers & ranchers.

There are 96,415 acres affected by these permits and 175 farmers/ranchers. If we're going to support agriculture sustainability, then they require access to land and water.

Over the year's farmers have tried to convert their permits to long term leases. Agriculture is committed to finding a long term solution as we cannot afford a long term legal battle over leases; farmers need to farm.

We cannot expect farmers to invest in their futures if the State is unwilling to provide long term leases and access to water. HB 2501, HD2 SD1– RELATING TO WATER RIGHTS.

Allows for a holdover disposition of water rights previously authorized pursuant to a lease during the pendency of an application for a lease renewal.

Chair Tokuda, Vice Dela Cruz, and Members of the Committee:

My name is Alan Gottlieb, and I am The Vice President of Ponoholo Ranch, a working cattle ranch on the Big Island of Hawaii. We steward over 10,000 acres of land, some Fee Simple, some long term leases from DLNR and one small Revocable Permit from DLNR.

Ponoholo Ranch **strongly supports** HB 2501,HD2 SD1 as this measure will provide continuing service to residents and agricultural producers in Hawaii.

This bill provides the Board of Land and Natural Resources the ability to provide longer-term holdover permits, over one year, for the use of water, when longer term permit applications are being considered, and in some cases litigated. Without this water many farming operations will fail.

Some have said that these permits should be temporary: **WE AGREE**

Some have said that DLNR should work to convert Temporary Permits to Long-Term Leases: **WE AGREE**. However, this may take years to happen, based on current rules and regulations.

The Attorney General has rendered an opinion that this bill may eventually help other water permit holders. The Attorney General has stated, "Currently, we understand that in the County of Hawai'i, seven water revocable permits have been issued. If one of those permit holders applies for a lease and a contested case is requested in connection with the lease application and/or the revocable permit, that the applicant would be in the same situation as Alexander & Baldwin."

Some may argue, that this is currently not applicable in one breath, and in another breath say that all RP holders should apply for Long Term Permits.

The Attorney General goes on to say: "If the bill is not passed, the Board might be required to discontinue use of water under the revocable permit until the case is decided and a decision is made on the lease application." Based on the recent court ruling, additional questions remain for all RP holders:

Does the judge's ruling affect those RP holders, either water or land, who have held the permit for years? In other words, might the precedent of the judge's ruling that determined the temporary permits held by A&B should not be renewed year after year, then affect all RPs which have been renewed for several years?

The judge's ruling said that the statute meant for RPs to be temporary and having an RP go on year after year is not temporary, and therefore, not in compliance with the statute. The judge did not say that the reason for an RP going on for a long time is a factor in its validity. Under that ruling, any RP that has gone on for a number of years, regardless of whether it was renewed year after year (as most RPS are) or whether it was in holdover status, whether it's gone on for a long time because of a contested case or for any other reason, is not temporary, and therefore not in compliance with the statute.

While this measure has been portrayed as affecting a single agricultural entity, it's impact has far greater ramifications.

The State of Hawaii and this legislature says they support agriculture and want it to succeed. If so, the state should provide for water for farmers, even when long term permits are held up through ongoing litigation. We respectfully ask this committee to pass HB 2501, HD2 SD1 and we appreciate the opportunity to testify on this important matter.

Comments: Sorry for the second testimony but I didn't realize that some of you folks were told ANOTHER false scare tactic. There is a bogus idea going around (gee I wonder who originated it!) that if HB2501 isn't passed that 37,000 people supplied by the County of Maui via the EMI ditches will lose their water. This is absolutely FALSE. A&B subsidiary East Maui Irrigation, the company which operates the system, supplies the County with 8.3 million gallons a day out of the up to 450 million gallons a day that EMI diverts for A&B. HOWEVER, A&B'S LACK OF A LEGAL PERMIT DOES NOT AFFECT THE SUPPLY OF WATER TO MAUI COUNTY AT ALL! The County of Maui has an exemption from the Court's decision because it supplies water to the general public. Let me repeat that: County of Maui (and the upcountry users) HAVE AN EXEMPTION FROM THE COURT'S DECISION. Nothing is going to happen to their water. Comments: Aloha Chair Tokuda, Vice Chair Dela Cruz, and Members of the Committee, My name is Lisa Grandinetti. I am a third year student at the University of Hawai'i at Manoa studying Ethnic Studies and Women's Studies. I also work for UNITE HERE! Local 5, and have been involved with our political organizing group called the AiKea Movement since my senior year at Mililani High School. I would like to express my serious concern about HB 2501. One of the first hearings I ever went to was for the proposed development Koa Ridge, which is adjacent to Mililani. The development included three to five thousand expensive homes, a non-union hotel, and a mall. I strongly opposed this bill, along with many others, for several important reasons. First of all, there were no plans for where the children of families that were supposedly going to live there would go to school, and the surrounding public schools – including my alma matter – were already over-crowded. Second, the development would be on prime agricultural land where food was actually already being grown – this kind of land is needed for Hawai'i to achieve food sovereignty. Third, the houses built would be unaffordable to a large majority of people in Hawai'i who desperately need housing, while the service jobs provided by the development would provide the community with only very low wages. And finally, there were no plans for meeting the community's water needs. Koa Ridge may seem irrelevant to the issue at hand, but I see a direct parallel between it and HB 2501. You see, the Koa Ridge development was proposed by Castle and Cooke. HB 2501 is being advocated for by, and really actually exists solely for the benefit of Alexander and Baldwin. These two companies' origins in Hawai'i go all the way back to the plantation era, in which a few very powerful missionary-turned-businessmen ruled Hawai'i's economy and people with an oligarchy coined the "Big Five." Alexander and Baldwin and Castle and Cooke, part of the Big Five, controlled Hawai'i political economy in order to exploit ordinary working people for the purpose of maximizing their profits without interference by the government. In fact, they went as far as controlling the government itself to ensure their interests were the only priority. Today, it seems as though nothing has changed. Just like Castle and Cooke with Koa Ridge, Alexander and Baldwin have used individual local workers to create the illusion that the community is behind HB 2501. In actuality, thousands of individuals both in the community directly affected by the bill and others outside East Maui, in addition to countless organizations across the islands have publically come out in

opposition to the bill, and many of them have driven and flown far to testify at hearings. HB 2501 and Alexander and Baldwin's diverting of water away from small local kalo farmers is not only a part of decades of Native Hawaiians fighting for their rights to their own resources on East Maui, but it represents a continuation of the Big Five's history assault on and exploitation of the Native Hawaiian community and Hawai'i's people all together. In solidarity with the kalo farmers in East Maui and the Native Hawaiian community in general, I strongly urge you to hold Alexander and Baldwin accountable, break the pattern of government support of the corporate elite, and oppose HB 2501. Under the Public Trust Doctrine and Hawaii's Constitution water is a public trust resource that is "... held in trust by the State for the benefit of the people." (Article XI, Section I). But this bill would undermine that public trust doctrine. Judge Rhonda Nishimura has already ruled that A&B's four revocable permits were invalid. Before that ruling, BLNR had been extending water use permits on a "holdover" basis for more than a dozen years. In her ruling Judge Nishimura said that allowing holdover tenants to "occupy public lands almost in perpetuity for continuous, multiple 1-year periods" is inconsistent with the "public interest and legislative intent." HB 2501 SD1 is an end-run around Judge Nishimura's ruling by allowing A&B to hold onto its water rights until BLNR makes a determination on a long-term lease. If HB 2501 SD1 is passed, it confirms that BLNR and A&B are above the law and that the welfare of communities and natural resources is not as important.
