Chairpersons Inouye and Gabbard and Members of the joint Committees:

My name is James Nakatani, Executive Director of the Agribusiness Development Corporation ("ADC"). The ADC supports House Bill No. 2593 H.D. 1 which authorizes the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds for Hawaii Renewable Resources, LLC.

The ADC is an attached agency to the Hawaii Department of Agriculture ("HDOA") tasked with transitioning fallow plantation land into cropland to provide business opportunities for local diversified agriculture operations, and addressing roadblocks that affect today's and tomorrow's agriculture industry through research and development partnerships.

One of the challenges the Hawaii agriculture industry is facing today is the skyrocketing cost of imported feed. The proposed project of Hawaii Renewable

Resources seeks to help the State address this bottleneck by developing a specialized facility on Oahu that converts food waste and green agriculture crop into animal feeds and renewable energy.

In diversified agriculture operations alone, roughly 30 percent of crops grown do not reach the marketplace which means the farmer receives zero revenue for 30 percent of his or her harvest. "Zero waste" and "closed-loop" facilities such as the one in Hawaii Renewable Resources' proposal uses forward-thinking technology that can repurpose, reuse, or recycle these agriculture culls and waste that otherwise would be thrown away.

The ability to reuse agricultural waste and source feed locally will revolutionize the agriculture industry. In addition to the impact it will have on agriculture, the benefits and cost savings will present economic opportunities to an array of agriculture-related operations and businesses.
