**AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL PURPOSE REVENUE BONDS FOR
HAWAII RENEWABLE RESOURCES, LLC**

Senate Bill No. 2367 authorizes the issuance of Special Purpose Revenue Bonds (SPRB) up to \$30,000,000 to assist Hawaii Renewable Resources, LLC with the development of facilities for food crop, animal feed, and renewable non-fossil fuel production on Oahu pursuant to Part V, Chapter 39A, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

The Department is providing comments only to advise the Legislature and prospective SPRB parties that should the legislation be approved, approval of SPRB issuance will require further discussion and satisfactory credit underwriting review of the financing components with respect to any proposed financing.

Thank for the opportunity to testify on Senate Bill No. 2367 authorizing the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds for Hawaii Renewable Resources, LLC. The bill will provide bond funding for a material reprocessing facility, a closed-loop renewable and sustainable facility, a digester system, processing equipment for food and waste conversion to natural gas, processing equipment for feed development for pig and fish from food waste, production of soil amendment compost, recovery and use of carbon dioxide from renewable natural gas production for use as a plant nutrient, recovery of water for purification and use for farm crop irrigation, and production of solar electricity for facility use and cooling system. The Department supports this bill provided that it does not impact the priorities established in the Department's executive budget.

Chair Tokuda and Members of the Committee,

My name is James Nakatani, Executive Director of the Agribusiness Development Corporation (“ADC”). The ADC supports Senate Bill No. 2367 which authorizes the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds for Hawaii Renewable Resources, LLC.

The ADC is an attached agency to the Hawaii Department of Agriculture (“HDOA”) tasked with transitioning fallow plantation land into cropland to provide business opportunities for local diversified agriculture operations, and addressing roadblocks that affect today’s and tomorrow’s agriculture industry through research and development partnerships.

One of the challenges the Hawaii agriculture industry is facing today is the skyrocketing cost of imported feed. The proposed project of Hawaii Renewable Resources seeks to help the State address this bottleneck by developing a

specialized facility on Oahu that converts food waste and green agriculture crop into animal feeds and renewable energy.

In diversified agriculture operations alone, roughly 30 percent of crops grown do not reach the marketplace which means the farmer receives zero revenue for 30 percent of his or her harvest. “Zero waste” and “closed-loop” facilities such as the one in Hawaii Renewable Resources’ proposal uses forward-thinking technology that can repurpose, reuse, or recycle these agriculture culls and waste that otherwise would be thrown away.

The ability to reuse agricultural waste and source feed locally will revolutionize the agriculture industry. In addition to the impact it will have on agriculture, the benefits and cost savings will present economic opportunities to an array of agriculture-related operations and businesses.
