

- 1 Fiscal Implications: None.
- 2 **Department Testimony:** Firefighters are potentially exposed to various mixtures of
- 3 particulates, gases, mists, and fumes of an organic and/or inorganic nature that may have acute,
- 4 toxic and carcinogenic effects. There are nearly 2,000 state and county firefighters in nearly 100
- 5 fire stations throughout Hawaii. Some studies indicate that the long-term health consequences of
- 6 workplace exposure to harmful toxicants may only become apparent after retirement. The

Chairs Baker and Nishihara, Vice Chairs Kidani and Espero, and Members of the Committee,

S.C.R 8 and S.R. 6 request a task force to examine the issues related to cancer in the firefighting profession. The task force will not include a representative of the Employees' Retirement System (ERS); however, one of its main purposes is to provide recommendations for revisions to the state workers' compensation statutes to expedite workers' compensation benefits for firefighters diagnosed with cancer.

As the ERS does not have a role in workers' compensation determinations, the ERS staff has no position on these resolutions or this task force.

We wish to comment that an ancillary connection between workers' compensation and ERS benefits is that ERS members are required to file for workers' compensation in order to submit a claim for ERS service-connected disability benefits. The approval of workers' compensation benefits, however, does not guarantee that a member will be approved for service-connected disability retirement and does not have conclusive impact on the outcome of the disability application. All disability cases are reviewed by the ERS Medical Board which consists of three



physicians. Recommendations by the Medical Board to the ERS Board of Trustees (Board) are based on medical records, reports and interviews with the claimant. Upon review, the Board may decide to approve, deny or remand Medical Board recommendations.

Section 88-79, HRS, provides for service-connected disability benefits for a member who is permanently incapacitated for duty as the natural and proximate result of an accident occurring while in the actual performance of duty or as the cumulative result of an occupational hazard. This section already includes a rebuttable presumption that firefighters, police officers and sewer workers who are permanently incapacitated for duty as a result of any disease of the heart, lungs, or respiratory system, contracted such disease while in the performance of duty and as the result of the inherent occupational hazard of exposure to smoke inhalation, toxic gases, chemical fumes, and other toxic vapors.

These benefits are typically higher than regular retirement benefits and have no minimum age or service requirements. As a note of caution, should the task force recommendations lead to legislation for higher ERS benefits with additional cancer presumptive causes, the task force's mandate could result in the enhancement of benefits. This would be contrary to Act 29, Session Laws of Hawaii 2011, which placed a moratorium on retirement benefit enhancements until the ERS becomes fully funded. Any benefit enhancement would increase the ERS' \$8.7 billion unfunded liability, increase employer contributions and would lengthen the period required for the ERS to become fully funded. The ERS Board of Trustees will likely oppose any legislation which provides for enhanced retirement benefits and/or increases the System's unfunded liability.

SCR 8 / SR 6 AUTHORIZING THE FORMATION OF A TASK FORCE TO STUDY THE ISSUE OF A CANCER PRESUMPTIVE STATUTE RELATING TO FIRE FIGHTERS.

My name is Robert H. Lee and I am the President of the Hawaii Fire Fighters Association (HFFA), Local 1463, IAFF, AFL-CIO. The HFFA represents approximately 2,100 active-duty professional fire fighters throughout the State. We **SUPPORT** SCR 8 and SR 6, as it relates to the authorization of a task force to study the issue of a cancer presumptive statute as it relates to Hawaii's fire fighters.

Thirty-three states and eight Canadian provinces already have cancer presumptive laws that provide fire fighters with medical and service-connected disability benefits. Several studies, as recommended by the International Association of Fire Fighters (IAFF), serve as the basis that demonstrates the growing need for cancer presumptive legislation locally. In addition, despite our fire departments' efforts in improving procedures for cleaning the protective clothing and breathing apparatus, fire fighters are still exposed to carcinogens and toxicants while performing their duties as a study administered in 2014 entitled "Systemic Exposure to PAHs and Benzene in Firefighters Suppressing Controlled Structure Fires" have recently discovered. Such exposure to these carcinogens and toxicants during a fire fighter's career may not result in immediate manifestation of symptoms or cancer diagnosis but instead, years after retirement.

SCR 8 and SR 6 both authorize the formation of a task force to examine the possibility of implementing a cancer presumptive statute relating to fire fighters through recommendations, if any, on revisions to workers' compensation statutes and fire departments' administrative rules. With the ever-increasing number in statistics through research conducted by legitimate, prominent organizations and researchers relating to the risk of cancer as well as infectious diseases and illnesses associated with exposure to patient care and biochemical substances for fire fighters in comparison to the general population, it is important that discussion begins.

HFFA appreciates the Committee's favorable consideration of this measure and ask that you pass both SCR 8 and SR 6.
