TESTIMONY Kamehameha Schools

RE: SCR 125/SR91 REQUESTING COLLABORATIVE EFFORTS FOR STEWARDSHIP AND PRESERVATION OF WAIPI'O VALLEY.

Kamehameha Schools supports Senate Concurrent Resolution 125/SR 91. Waipio Valley is an important place for all people, and especially Native Hawaiians. We believe that shared stewardship is the only way the valley can be cared for appropriately. As representatives of the people and families most engaged in the valley on a daily basis, and with members with ancestral ties to the valley, we support the WVSA to take the lead on convening a conversation on how shared stewardship should look and how it can be achieved. We will look to them and work with them to address the work called for in this resolution.
