1. A brief description of the applicant's background;

The Hawaii Theatre has played a significant role in Hawaii's cultural landscape since 1922, from its earliest days as a vaudeville house to its present incarnation as the state's foremost historic performance venue. With 1,400 seats, the Theatre is the second largest proscenium performance facility in the state.

After falling into disrepair and facing the wrecking ball, a group of concerned citizens formed the nonprofit Hawaii Theatre Center (HTC) and raised the \$32 million needed to acquire the property under the Theatre and adjoining properties and restore this historic treasure as a world-class presentation hall. The beautifully restored Theatre reopened in 1996 with the mission to benefit Hawaii residents and visitors by:

- Preserving one of Hawaii's national historic landmarks
- Showcasing Hawaiian cultural arts
- Producing and presenting high-quality, viable entertainment opportunities to enrich the community
- Offering performing arts education for preK-12 students
- Providing a rental venue for other performing arts organizations and promoters
- Attracting business investment to the surrounding neighborhood.

Since reopening in 1996, HTC has served more than 2 million patrons of all ages, ethnicities and socio-economic backgrounds. In this past year, the Theatre has welcomed film screenings, cultural programs and other public events. These included HTC's own season of local, national and international performing artists as well as shows presented by other licensed users.

2. The goals and objectives related to the request;

Having served the residents and visitors to Hawaii with high quality, impactful, and relevant artistic productions since its renovation more than 20 years ago, Hawaii Theatre must now plan strategically to ensure we continue to meet current community needs, maximize the impact of our services and address the opportunities and challenges of a changing future.

Although state-of-the-art when the Theatre re-opened in 1996, its systems and equipment have become out-of-date and inefficient over the years. We have invested in significant upgrades in recent years, including a new energy-saving air conditioning system, new infrared ADA hearing system for the hearing impaired, a state-of-the-art sound system and, in partnership with the State of Hawaii, we installed a digital film projection system in 2013 that has elevated our historic 'movie palace' to a world-class cinema venue, with Dolby Surround Sound and 3-D technology capable of accommodating today's high-tech film industry and increasing HTC's programming opportunities. The State also approved funding to replace our outdated stage lights, which were no longer manufactured. This ensures our stage meets the technological requirements so the Theatre remains a competitive venue option.

Our goal now is to complete "green" technology lighting upgrades in the interior and exterior of the Theatre that will enable HTC to meet the evolving infrastructure and technological requirements of a state-of-the-art performance venue, greatly reduce our operating costs as well as our carbon footprint, and enhance the safety and live theatre experience for our audiences.

Priority 1: Replace interior lights with LED lights and replace dimming system.

As a public venue, our patron's safety is a top priority. Replacing the lighting in the first and second floor lobbies, chair aisle and wall-mounted aisle lights (these lights are constantly on and have limited lifespan, and require constant, costly maintenance), Weyand Room, restrooms, Box Office, as well as the administrative offices and dressing rooms will allow the Theatre to increase the level of lighting (brightness) in these areas. The Theatre's architectural lighting is comprised of highly inefficient cove and dome lighting, which utilizes hundreds of incandescent lamps that create heat, increase air conditioning requirements, negatively impact finishes and are prohibitively expensive to operate. Replacing all of the interior lights with energy-efficient LED lights will also require the replacement of the dimming system, which will allow the Theatre to fully maximize the output and ROI potential, which is estimated to reduce utility costs by 50%.

Priority 2: Replace exterior lights with LED lights

Replacing the exterior lights, including the Bethel Street exterior façade and the under marquee lighting, will enable Hawaii Theatre to meet the rapidly evolving infrastructure, adopt green technology and greatly reduce operating costs as well as our carbon footprint. Investing in these capital improvement priorities today will have a significant impact in assuring the historic Hawaii Theatre remains a safe, sound and sustainable cultural resource for our community, well into the future.

3. The public purpose and need to be served;

Nonprofit organizations account for approximately 66% of HTC's licensed users. HTC provides a state-of-the-art, professionally managed venue – at greatly reduced rates – for these groups to stage fundraising concerts, hula and other dance programs, cultural pageants and festivals, student plays and music concerts, and other events. Many of these organizations would not otherwise be able to afford bringing their show to a professional stage like Hawaii Theatre. We offer ticket discounts to military, seniors and students.

HTC's affordably priced educational programming for PreK-12 students provides high-quality performing arts experiences to meet DOE content standards in literacy and fine arts; enhance student learning; and supplement school curricula in the area of performing arts. Tickets are just \$5 for children, \$10 for adults and children under three are free. We also offer one free ticket to a teacher, per every 20 students. In the 2015-16 school year, our education programs reached more than 13,000 participants, with students from Title I public schools accounting for 25% of the student participation. This included over 300 band students from three nearby Title I middle schools and 1,200 family members and peers who participated in the Punchbowl Music Festival, an annual showcase established and hosted at no cost by Hawaii Theatre Center since 2007.

Hawaii Theatre also partners with local groups to provide shows for the public, with no admission fee, including the annual Combined Military Band Appreciation concert, Honolulu's largest military appreciation event and the Royal Hawaiian Band holiday concert.

With dozens of licensed users bringing their events to the Hawaii Theatre each year, and an annual average of nearly 90,000 patrons attending these shows, the need to upgrade our lighting infrastructure to meet modern, energy-saving technology standards is becoming ever more urgent. Our business neighbors and the community in general benefit each time we have a performance on our stage.

Providing a safe, technically superb and sustainable venue for presenters and patrons will enable Hawaii Theatre Center to continue to serve as the economic development catalyst for its neighborhood, enhance student learning, support other nonprofit groups, sustain an historic landmark, and greatly enrich the lives of Hawaii residents and visitors well into the 21st century.

4. Describe the target population to be served; and

The project will benefit approximately 90,000 Hawaii residents and visitors to Oahu each year, including more than 13,000 students and their families; and an average of 30-40 presenters each year who bring their events to our Theatre, including nonprofit arts, civic and community organizations that use the Theatre at greatly reduced rates.

5. Describe the geographic coverage.

Located in downtown Honolulu, Hawaii Theatre Center's primary geographic reach is the Island of Oahu, although Theatre patrons and performing artists come from across the state to attend many of the local, national and international shows that do not travel to the other islands, or to share their talents with Oahu's larger audience base.

The greatest impact of Hawaii Theatre is with individual patrons on the Island of Oahu. We have a database of more than 120,000 individual patrons on Oahu and patrons found on every major Hawaiian island, as well as the US mainland, Japan, Germany, Korea, China, the Philippines and Europe.

The Hawaii Theatre Center will retrofit the expensive, obsolete, and inefficient incandescent lighting technology used in the architectural lighting and throughout (interior and exterior) the historic Hawaii Theatre with proven, energy efficient, long lasting LED (Light Emitting Diode) technologies.

To implement the lighting retrofit, the Technical Services & Facilities Manager will reconfirm equipment pricing and place the order and work with contracted vendors to schedule and do the installation. He will also review and work with the programming department to determine the best time to execute the retrofit project. Additionally, he will facilitate theatre access with vendors, receiving and staging of equipment, and receive training on the new system and will in turn facilitate the training of the new system with the stage staff.

The board has demonstrated a commitment to the mission of the Hawaii Theatre Center. The President serves as the chief executive officer, reports to the Board of Directors, and is responsible for all daily operations of the organization. The President is supported by a management team comprising of a Director of Programming and Director of Development. This team manages the day-to-day operations of Hawaii Theatre Center programs, facilities, programming and personnel.

The Theatre staff has a broad scope of skills and knowledge to administer and initiate programming and maintain the facilities. The Theatre has an exemplary history of exhibiting the capacity, skills, knowledge and experience necessary to complete major capital projects that comply with local building codes and preservation standards in a fiscally efficient and responsible manner.

Major capital projects include:

- 1996 Completed \$21 million Hawaii Theatre interior restoration
- 2005 Completed \$11.5 million Hawaii Theatre exterior restoration
- 2006 Completed exterior renovation of the Theatre's Nu'uanu Avenue properties

- 2010 Completed \$1.03 million Hawaii Theatre HVAC (air conditioning) installation
- 2011 Completed sound system upgrade and cyclorama (backdrop) LED lights

B. Facilities

Hawaii Theatre Center is a state-of-the-art 1,400-seat performance center with a 16,010 square foot footprint that is listed on both the State and National Historic Registers.

In planning for the restoration and renovation of the historic Theatre, architects were very mindful of all ADA requirements. The Hawaii Theatre Center underwent a complete Site Survey in October 1997 by an independent third party contractor and any deficiencies were identified and corrected. The Theatre has taken special measures to insure that wheelchair and hearing disabled patrons are able to enjoy performances by providing:

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- Wheelchair and companion seating
- ADA signage
- Signed performances
- Infrared assisted hearing devices
- Sensitivity training for ushers

Lampitelli has been with the Hawaii Theatre since 1998 and previously served as Stage Manager and Production Manager and Assistant Facility Manager. Jude facilitated onsite coordination of the Hawaii Theatre exterior renovation, installation of the Theatre marquee, the installation of the roof in 2009, and the installation of the 2010 HVAC project. Lampitelli oversaw the theatre's sound and lighting upgrade in 2010 and the installation of the digital projector system in 2013.

Elizabeth O'Brien, Director of Programming

O'Brien will work with Lampitelli on scheduling the lighting retrofit project with the programming schedule.

O'Brien joined HTC in 2010. She was promoted to director of audience services in 2015 with responsibilities for front of the house operations, and in 2016 was named director of programming, responsible for contracting and licensing all productions at the Theatre; marketing and promotion of all HTC Presents shows; and managing front of house, backstage and box office staff. Born and raised in Hawaii, she studied film and theatre on the mainland and performed around the US, Canada and Europe.

Ruth Bolan, President

Bolan will oversee the overall management of the retrofit project.

Bolan is a seasoned executive leader with extensive experience in Hawaii's nonprofit sector, was named president of Hawaii Theatre Center in June 2014. Her background in theatre and television production, fundraising, business development and organizational management bring valuable capabilities to the organization.

Before joining Hawaii Theatre Center, Bolan was managing director of external affairs at Teach for America Hawai'i where she was responsible for all fundraising, marketing, communications, community engagement, and district and school partnerships. From 2005 to 2012 she was executive director of Pacific Islanders in Communications, a national nonprofit media arts corporation funded by the Corporation for Public Broadcasting, where she also was executive producer for several documentary projects that were nationally broadcast on PBS. Prior to that, Bolan served for three years as executive director of 'Ohi'a Productions, the nonprofit theatre company founded by the late Lisa Matsumoto, where she turned around its insolvent operations and expanded performances from school cafeterias to Hawaii Theatre and other venues.

Bolan received a bachelor of arts degree with honors from Harvard University and later completed Harvard Business School's High Potentials Leadership Program and Stanford University's Executive Program for Non-Profit Leaders.

Jude Lampitelli, Technical Services & Facilities Manager

Lampitelli will serve as project manager and select/approve products, vendors, and contractors as well as coordinate the work schedule. He will also facilitate theatre access with vendors, receiving and staging of equipment, training on the new system. He will in turn facilitate the training of the new system with the stage staff.

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This position will be contracted to do the installation of new lighting. They will spec the fixtures, design their integration into the Theatre's current architecture and auditorium dimming system and facilitate the installation and programming.

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


