From exercise to social needs, from childcare to volunteerism, from preschool to preventive health, the Y doesn't just strengthen our bodies. It strengthens our community.

The Y is so much more than a gym. It's a cause, dedicated to youth development, healthy living and social responsibility.

For 97 years, we've been proud to help our neighbors learn, grow and thrive. Yet we're called to do so much more.

Hilo faces new challenges that create a greater need than ever for the work we do every day. Fortunately, where some see obstacles, we see opportunities for our members, volunteers and staff to make a difference.

But we need your support to make it happen. Together, we can achieve so much more.

2. The goals and objectives related to the request;

We believe Hilo can be so much more. Every day, we take on the challenges that will shape our community's future—challenges like arthritis prevention, childhood obesity, and the diabetes epidemic.

Together with our 190 members, our 50 volunteers, and our friends and partners throughout the community, we make Hilo stronger by focusing on three priorities: youth development, healthy living and social responsibility.

## 3. The public purpose and need to be served;

All kids deserve the opportunity to discover who they are and what they can achieve, under the guidance of adults who care about them and believe in their potential. We see every interaction with young people as an opportunity for learning and development.

Parents want to bring their kids to the Y so they can exercise but there is underdeveloped space for the kids to play and learn. A newly remodeled Childwatch area and Youth restrooms would provide for families and others in Hilo. Single moms, Seniors watching grandchildren, and the entire family can all come and play at the Y with a Childwatch room.

These are just a few of the many ways we help young people form healthy habits, develop their skills and build strong relationships. Remodeling infrastructure and expanding to include a Childwatch and Youth restrooms area can provide:

- Expanding successful programs to reach more people who need them, with a focus on the most vulnerable in our community
- Help young people develop self-esteem, character values and leadership qualities by providing innovative and nurturing youth programs and offering strong environmental connections through YMCA camp programs
- Creating a community that support healthy living by addressing childhood obesity and chronic disease among children and adults and supporting their physical, intellectual and spiritual strength
- Instilling an ethic of volunteerism by providing opportunities for Hilo to give back and serve the community

Health and well-being are all about balance. That's why we help people and families build and maintain healthy habits for spirit, mind and body in their everyday lives.

• The Y's Enhanced Fitness has proven to be very effective in preventing arthritis among our seniors. Lack of funding has made it challenging to provide the proper equipment and training to create this much needed program. By helping young people, adults, families and seniors from all backgrounds improve their health and well-being, we build a stronger Hilo every day.

Replacing roofs and improving sewers doesn't seem like the solution to developing a healthier community. But replacing and repairing this kind of infrastructure allows the Y to focus on what they do best, building a stronger community.

The Y's Enhanced Fitness helps to prevent arthritis among seniors and provides an avenue to diabetes prevention. Without infrastructure improves and equipment these life changing programs set on the back burning.

Bids will be submitted for the project and reviewed by the Y's Facility Committee. The Facility Committee will recommend a contractor to the Y's Board of Directors. The Board will review the proposal and vote on the selection of a contractor.

Quality assurance of the project shall be reviewed, monitored and evaluated by the CEO of the Y weekly, the Y's Facility Committee monthly and then by the Y's Board of Directors monthly.

YUSA, with 165 years of building Y's, provides extensive information on buildings and renovations and will be consulted on a regular basis.

- Improve outdoor lighting to include parking lot

The Island of Hawaii YMCA has a proven track record of serving the community in a myriad of programs and services, since it opened in 1919. With the backing of the national organization, YUSA, for professional training and staff development to enhance continuing education, the Island of Hawaii YMCA is limitless as to experience and services opportunities.

The YUSA has a building facility department that provides excellent advice on construction. Over the last 165 years the Y has built many buildings completed renovations and currently has over 2,800 facilities nationally. In addition to using YUSA as a resource the Maui Family YMCA will be lending a hand in reviewing the process to include financing, expenditures and bid process.

#### B. Facilities

The Island of Hawaii YMCA facility in Hilo was built February 13, 1966 as the first of three phases. The first phase included current building including a

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commercial kitchen, multipurpose room, weight/exercise room, childcare center and admin offices. The current facility is operated on land owned by the Y.

The second phase was to include a pool, locker rooms and racquetball courts and the third phase a gymnasium. No additions and few renovations have been done since the original building in 1966.

All current Y facilities meet ADA requirements as well the new construction.

# V. Personnel: Project Organization and Staffing

#### A. Proposed Staffing, Staff Qualifications, Supervision and Training

Once the renovations are completed the Y will be prepared to hire staff to develop and implement programs like arthritis prevention and diabetes prevention to help in developing a healthier community.

The Y uses the San Diego Y and the Maui Family Y as training partners for staff and volunteers. In addition, YUSA has an extensive online training curriculum for a myriad of Y programs.

The renovations will allow the Y to create 2 full-time, 2 part-time staff and 40 additional volunteers to develop and implement programs and services. It is estimated that participation will increase over 50% in the first three years of operation.


