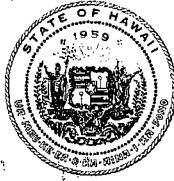

**REPORT ON THE NUMBER OF PEN REGISTER ORDERS
AND ORDERS FOR TRAP AND TRACE DEVICES
APPLIED FOR BY LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES OF THE STATE**

Pursuant to Section 803-47(c), Hawaii Revised Statutes

Calendar Year 2016

Submitted to the Twenty-Ninth State Legislature
Regular Session of 2017

Section 803-47(c), Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires that, "The attorney general, at least twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session, shall annually report to the legislature on the number of pen register orders and orders for trap and trace devices applied for by law enforcement agencies of the State."

From January 1, 2016, to December 31, 2016, there were two (2) pen register orders, and orders for trap and trace devices applied for and three (3) releases of subscriber's information for telephone numbers. Those orders and releases were sought by the Maui County Department of the Prosecuting Attorney.
